#### MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

#### Welcome to Term 1

Welcome to Quakers Hill High School for our incoming Year 7 students and our new students in other year groups. Our school strives to be a place where students can thrive in a welcoming and stimulating environment where their individual needs and aspirations are a priority.

#### Welcome to our new staff

We are very fortunate to have a fully staffed school to start the year, which is especially pleasing given the state-wide teacher shortage.

This year we welcome Ms Perez, our relieving head teacher Secondary Studies, Ms Doyle in Creative Arts, Mr Forrester in TAS, Ms Uppal in Science, Ms Xu in Languages, and Ms Tarasenko, our relieving Nirimba Collegiate deputy principal.

#### **Enrolments at Quakers**

With almost 900 students in Years 7-12, including about 80 in Year 11 this year, we are seeing high demand for places at our school. As a result, we have consistently applied a non-local (out of area) enrolment procedure where we will only consider students who are outside our drawing area who currently have a sibling enrolled at our school. With our reputation for HSC success growing, this is an important strategy to ensure we do not overcrowd our school with increasing numbers of senior students.

#### Freshening up the school

Students and staff returning for the new school year will have noticed that several areas of the school have been refreshed, with some projects ongoing:

- Science labs have all been refurbished now, with new workstations, equipment, ceilings, flooring, and modern furniture on the way.
- The remaining classroom ceilings are also being replaced, with a couple of classrooms at time and a completion date of mid Term 2
- Painting of our school will continue, though at a slower pace due to NSW budget constraints. I hope it will be completed by the end of the year, but this will depend on funding
- Our big ticket projects are all at various stages of planning and construction. These
  are funded by an accumulation of funds that had accumulated over many years
  and must be spent otherwise they are returned to the NSW Treasury. We took the
  opportunity to make sure we spent them to improve facilities for our students and
  community. They include:

- ♦ Eastern Carpark electronic gates, which are almost finished
- Basketball/Netball/Volleyball court on the grass area near the Quad starting in two weeks add planned to be completed by the end of the term
- New storage shed for hall equipment, PE and Sport, as well as general maintenance to replace the shipping containers near the hall, starting later this term
- Enclosure of the café area adjacent to the commercial kitchen for a flexible function/ teaching space, starting later this term or early next term
- New bubblers and bins around the school, already completed
- Additional picnic tables around the school on concrete pads, particularly in the Quad and Oval areas, to be completed in the Term 1 holidays

#### A New School Plan

This term will be an important one for school planning, with a new Strategic Improvement Plan in progress. We are keen to have student and community input into our future directions and priorities. Our draft plan is to strive for excellence in the following areas that are already very strong:

- Explicit teaching in literacy and numeracy
- HSC strategies for success
- Student attendance
- Community engagement
- Student wellbeing and sense of belonging
- Post-school pathways to higher education, training and employment

#### Parents and Citizens Association (P&C)

Huge thank you to our P&C association committee, led by Annette Ward as President, with Linda Robertson as Treasurer, Kylie Estall as Secretary and Emma D'Angelo as vice-president. We have many other parents and community members who have supported the school and often attend meetings. I am particularly grateful for the work of Linda and our uniform shop volunteers, who have given many hours of service to our school community to ensure our uniform is easily accessible out of school hours in the summer holidays and is very good value.

Our next P&C meeting is this Monday 12 February at 6.30pm on site in the café area towards the back left hand side of the school. Please come along and enjoy some light refreshments from our Year 12 Hospitality students. It is a great chance to have a look at our school, meet new people, learn about our initiatives, and raise issues or ask questions of the school senior executive. The main carpark gate will be open so you can use the staff carpark. I hope to see you there!

#### School fees and voluntary contributions

During the summer holidays the issue of public school fees and contributions was prominent in the media. The department of Education has asked schools to remind parents that the "voluntary contribution" that schools ask parents to pay is just that - voluntary. At Quakers Hill High school we have capped this amount at \$70 for several years now. This amount is separate from subject fees that relate to particular courses that students choose and which faculties rely on to purchase teaching and learning resources such as musical instruments, art supplies, ingredients for practical lessons in various subjects, materials for woodwork etc. artefacts and equipment for HSIE, books and textbooks across the school, and resources that we need to deliver quality teaching and learning beyond the basic level of funding we receive from the government. We do understand that cost of living pressures means that sometimes families may need extra time to pay these fees. Please reach out to our school office or your child's deputy principal if you would like to request assistance or an accommodation with fees. I note that many of our parent community have already paid some or all the course fees, which we appreciate, and which goes a long way to enhancing our offerings here at Quakers Hill High School

#### **New Student Behaviour Strategy**

The department of education has updated and refreshed their Student Behaviour Strategy to assist schools to manage disruptive behaviours as well as unsafe and disrespectful behaviours in NSW public schools. This strategy works hand in hand with our school's SMART Code, where we expect our students to be Safe, Motivated, Academic, Respectful and Tolerant learners.

#### **Guidelines for Goal Setting**

Embarking on a new school year provides an excellent opportunity to establish meaningful goals for personal and academic growth. Setting goals not only enhances your focus but also helps shape the kind of student you aspire to become. To ensure your goals are both attainable and inspiring, consider the following SMARTIES criteria.

SPECIFIC: Make goals as detailed and specific as possible. Avoid vague goals like 'I want to do better in Maths', instead make them very detailed and specific. Exactly what do you want to achieve?

MEASUREABLE: A crucial aspect of goal-setting is having a way to measure your progress. Define clear indicators that signal achievement, enabling you to track your success along the way. This could involve setting specific targets, such as achieving a certain grade or completing a set number of tasks.

ACTION-ORIENTED: Your short-term goals should be the action steps you need to take to achieve the medium and longer-term goals.

(Another version of SMARTIES uses aspirational instead of action-oriented, i.e. your goals should inspire you and stretch and challenge you beyond your comfort level.)

RELEVANT & REALISTIC: Goals change, so if your goal is no longer relevant, you need to change it too. Although your goals should stretch you beyond your comfort zone, they need to still be based in reality. Create challenging goals by all means, but not totally unrealistic ones.

TIME-BASED: Your goals need to have a 'to complete by' date to give you something to aim for. Assigning deadlines to your goals provides a sense of urgency and direction.

INTERESTING: Choose goals that genuinely interest you and align with your values. Pursuing objectives that are personally meaningful increases motivation and commitment. When you find your goals interesting and worthwhile, you're more likely to stay dedicated to achieving them.

EMOTIONAL: Express the emotion behind your goals using powerful language. This emotional connection enhances your commitment and helps



you stay connected to the purpose of your objectives. When you can articulate the significance of your goals, they become more compelling and personally resonant.

SUCCESS ORIENTED: Frame your goals in a positive and success-focused manner. Instead of focusing on what you want to avoid or improve, emphasise the positive outcomes you aim to achieve. A positive mindset fosters resilience, optimism, and a greater likelihood of success.

By incorporating these SMARTIES guidelines into your goal-setting process, you increase the likelihood of turning your aspirations into tangible achievements throughout the school year. Remember that the journey of goal-setting is as valuable as the destination, fostering personal growth, motivation, and a sense of accomplishment.
