Student Safety – Pick-Up and Drop-Off Reminders

A reminder to all families about the importance of following our school's safety expectations during drop-off and pick-up times. For the safety of all students and families:

- **Godfrey Street** is the designated area for student drop-off and pick-up.
- Please **do not stop in the 'No Stopping' zone** near the crossing, and do not double park - this creates a significant safety risk.
- **Nelson Street** is for **bus use only**, as the town bus and school buses regularly use this stop.
- The staff car park is not to be used by students or families at any time.
- Please ensure you and your children cross the road at designated crossing areas for everyone's safety.

TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL

If your child is sick at school

If your child gets sick or injured at school, the school will contact you. If your child is ill, they will go to an area where they can lie down and be monitored. You will be called to come and collect your child if they are too sick to go back to the classroom. For this reason, it is important to keep your contact details up to date with the school, including an alternative contact - such as a relative or neighbour - who the school can call if you are unavailable.

If your child is sick at home

From time to time your child may get sick. If they display any of the following symptoms, they should stay at home and see a doctor:

- a fever of 38°C or above
- vomiting or diarrhoea
- cough or respiratory symptoms
- cold or flu symptoms
- rashes of an unknown origin.
