Anxiety Project



Empowering Your Child Through Internal Locus of Control and SALON Conversations – Part 3/3

A 5-Step Conversation Tool to Build Mental Fitness Over the past two weeks, we've explored how to foster an internal locus of control and why praising your child's effort builds resilience. Today, we introduce a practical tool used in Anxiety Project schools that you can use at home, SALON conversations.

These short, structured chats (3–10 minutes) help children work through worries, problem-solve, and feel empowered.

SALON = Self-check, Acknowledge, List, Open-ended, Now what

- S Self-check: Are both of you in the right headspace to talk? Is this a good time?
- A Acknowledge: Show care and listen without jumping to solutions. "That sounds tough. I can see you're upset."
- L List the facts: Name what's observable. "You said you were worried, and I noticed you seemed quieter than usual."
- Open-ended questions: Help them explore solutions. "What might you try next time?" or "What would you say to a friend in this situation?"

 N – Now what?: Let your child decide what to do next. "What's your plan?" Offer support, but let them lead.

Using this structure regularly empowers your child to take ownership of their emotions and problemsolving. It strengthens self-regulation, encourages calm communication, and reinforces the idea that they can influence outcomes, just like we explored in Weeks 8 and 9.

Celebrate effort and reflection, not just achievements. This builds confidence to learn from mistakes and face challenges with optimism.
