Inspiring a love of reading is RSPS's primary focus for Book Week 2025. We will hold our annual Book Parade on Wednesday 20th August 2025 where students and staff are encouraged to come dressed as their favourite literary characters, a character from one of the CBCA Book of the Year short-listed books, or something to do with this year's theme: Book an Adventure. Siblings and family members are invited to attend and dress up as well!

Students might like to wear a costume that they already have, or one that they could make themselves. Perhaps they could make a hat, or some other accessory to go with their outfit. Maybe they could find a book that might go with their costume, for example, you could wear footy clothes and be a character from 'Specky McGee', or you could wear your pyjamas and pretend you are a character in 'Pyjama Day'. *Please note:* In the event of wet weather, the parade will go ahead in a restricted space under the cola and in the hall. Due to limited space, parents and visitors cannot attend.

Last week, Years 2-6 reflected on their favourite book adventures through drawing, for Randwick City Library's art competition, Where Are You Going on Your Adventure? Selected student artwork will be displayed at Lionel Bowen Library, Maroubra during Book Week and one winner will be chosen from each school year, with the winning design printed onto a tote bag.


