Empowering Your Child Through Internal Locus of Control and SALON Conversations – Part 2 of 3

Building Resilient Kids – Praise the Process, Not the Person

Last week, we introduced the idea of helping children develop an internal locus of control, a belief that their actions influence outcomes. This week, we're sharing one simple shift you can make at home to support this mindset: process praise.

What's the Difference?

Person praise:

"You're so clever!"

"You're naturally good at this!"

Process praise:

"I love how you tried a few different ways to solve that problem."

"You put in so much effort practising, that's why it went well!"

Research by Dr Carol Dweck shows that when children are praised for their effort and strategy, they are more likely to:

- Take on challenges
- Learn from mistakes
- Persist even when something is difficult

Whereas when they're praised only for their natural ability, they may begin to fear failure and avoid risk. By shifting the way we give praise, we help children recognise their own influence over outcomes—reinforcing that internal locus of control we spoke about last week.

Next week, we'll introduce a helpful conversation framework you can use at home: SALON conversations.

How it works

Year 5 students take part in three one-hour

- Align with the NSW curriculum
- Include connecting with Country and road safety safety knowledge
- Encourage mapping and spatial
- Empower students to design their own active travel routes

These routes are transformed into official maps by council officers and installed using line markings and wayfinding signs.
