High Potential and Gifted Education

The academic talents of our students at Rainbow Street Public School were proudly showcased at last Friday's 3–6 Assembly. Thirteen students were recognised for their outstanding achievements in the ICAS school competition, receiving either a High Distinction or Distinction certificate. In total, 7 High Distinctions and 12 Distinctions were awarded.

Alongside these honours, many other students were presented with a Credit and/or Merit certificate by their teachers, acknowledging their strong performance. Considering that the ICAS competition is undertaken by thousands of students across more than 30 countries, this is an exceptional accomplishment for all who participated.



What's Been Happening In Supported Learning This Week?

As part of our science and technology program this term, Support Unit students from Stage 2 and Stage 3 have joined forces to explore our Solar System. Students worked in small groups to select a planet to research, gathering information about its features, atmosphere, moons, size and location. They have used their findings to create engaging and informative posters about their chosen planet. Over the coming weeks, students will be presenting their research to their peers and sharing what they have discovered. We look forward to celebrating their hard work and impressive scientific knowledge!





Congratulations ICAS Award Recipients

This year, Rainbow Street Public School reintroduced the International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS). ICAS is an independent skills-based assessment program that recognises and rewards student achievement in English, Maths, Science, Spelling, Writing and Digital Technologies. The assessments are updated annually to ensure they accurately measure students' understanding and capabilities across different subject areas.

The response to the reintroduction was very positive, with a strong number of students choosing to participate. All students who took part received a certificate acknowledging their effort and achievement. Students are ranked according to their percentile in each year level across Australia:

- Top 1% of students receive a High Distinction
- The next 10% receive a Distinction
- The following 25% receive a Credit
- The next 10% receive a Merit Certificate

The students photographed below received either a High Distinction or a Distinction, or in some cases both. We are extremely proud of their achievements and look forward to running this ICAS again in 2026.


PSSA Team Jersey
