Dear Parents and Carers,



1:15pm-1.30pm | Open classrooms





Understanding and Addressing Bullying Concerns

As part of our commitment to creating a safe and supportive environment for all students, I want to take a moment to discuss an important issue: bullying. Understanding what bullying is and how to identify it can empower us all to take action when necessary.

What is Bullying?

Bullying is defined by three key features:

- 1. **Misuse of Power**: It involves a misuse of power in a relationship.
- 2. **Intentional and Ongoing**: It is intentional, ongoing, and repeated over time.
- 3. **Causes Harm**: It involves behaviours that can cause harm to others.

It's essential to note that not every conflict or disagreement among students qualifies as bullying. A single incident, such as an argument or a disagreement with a friend, while upsetting, does not meet the criteria for bullying. These situations should be addressed and resolved, but they do not fall under the definition of bullying.

How to Identify Bullying

Bullying can manifest in various forms. Physical and verbal bullying, such as kicking or name-calling, are often more visible (overt). However, other types of bullying, such as social exclusion or spreading rumours, can be more subtle and harder to detect (covert).

Students may be bullied for various reasons, including:

- Their appearance, voice, or mannerisms
- Their background, religion, race, or culture
- A disability or difference in size or body shape
- Academic performance, hobbies, or achievements

Additionally, bullying can occur online through technology, known as cyberbullying. This form of bullying can be particularly distressing, as it often follows students beyond the school environment.

Signs Your Child Might Be Involved in Bullying

It's crucial to be vigilant and aware of the signs that may indicate your child is involved in bullying, either as a victim or a perpetrator. Some signs to look for include:

- Changes in mood or behaviour
- Reluctance to go to school or participate in activities
- Unexplained injuries or missing belongings
- Changes in eating or sleeping patterns
- Withdrawal from friends or activities they once enjoyed

If you notice any of these signs or have concerns about your child's well-being, we encourage you to reach out to us. Open communication between parents and school staff is vital in addressing bullying effectively.

Together, we can foster a caring school environment where all students feel safe and supported. If you have any questions or need further information, please don't hesitate to contact us.

What an AMAZING Term 1 for Kindergarten! They have all learnt the school rules and have shown me how well they are able to follow their class routines and know exactly what to do during their lessons.

As soon as I walked into their classroom, they could not contain their excitement to tell me about their upcoming week! This week, they will be participating in HARMONY DAY activities! Harmony Day is dedicated to celebrating Australia's cultural diversity. It is also an opportunity to pay tribute to the original inhabitants of the country, the Indigenous Australians. WOW! It was really nice to see the students of KA explaining why it is so important that we all respect each other despite our differences. They were also able to list our differences and found that our similarities FAR outweigh our differences- clever munchkins!

They also showed me their artwork they have been working on for display during our Harmony day tourthe Eiffel Tower. Can you guess which country this tower is located in? They also told me that the Eiffel tower just celebrated its 136th birthday!

The highlight of the term has been watching these young 5 year olds grow into mature, inquisitive learners ready to tackle any challenge! I got to visit KA and they were able to showcase their AMAZING literacy and numeracy skills. I am amazed that they are already beginning to sound out and blend 2 and 3 letter words. These smart cookies were also able to identify their numbers to 10 and to represent them using a tens frame, tally marks, on a number line or by counting objects from around the classroom. Some of us were just too clever and were extended to represent numbers to 20.




KA have been working extremely hard at refining their fine motor skills. They have built strong muscles as they continue to refine their skills of tracing, cutting straight and curved lines, painting to create patterns, writing not only their names but sentences, threading, lacing, molding and shaping playdough and even completing some tricky puzzles.



I was blown away by their artwork which they completed using water paints and pipettes .KA showed me how to gently squeeze a little amount of paint to create little circles as well as patterns. They let me join in the fun and after reading the books 'Hush little bunny' and 'That's not my bunny'. We decorated silhouette crafts of cute bunnies and they used their imagination to be as creative as they liked and MY GOODNESS, I loved their creativity! They looked FANTASTIC in our school office!

It has been such a pleasure visiting KA, and I am excited to see all the progress they will continue to make throughout the year!!

The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge is now open and Ringrose PS is excited to be participating!

What is the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge?

The PRC is a statewide Challenge that encourages students to develop a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students and enables them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition, but a challenge to encourage each student to read, to read more, and to read more widely.

All students who complete the challenge and have their reading record validated by the school's PRC coordinator will receive a certificate signed by the Premier of NSW.

How many books do students need to read?

Students in Kindergarten to Year 2 are challenged to read or experience 30 books. 20 of these books must be from the relevant Challenge booklists, and up to 10 books can be personal choice books. Books can be read with a parent, carer, teacher or another student.

Students in Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 20 books independently. At least 10 of these books must be from the relevant Challenge booklists, and up to 10 books can be personal choice books.

If a book is from an approved PRC series, students can enter up to 5 books as Challenge books, and can read up to 10 other books from the same series as Personal Choice books. More information on the rules of the Challenge can be found on the PRC website.

Books must be added to a student's online reading record by **Friday 22 August 2025** in order for their reading record to be validated and receive a certificate.

How do students log their reading?

Students can access the PRC's <u>Student Experience site</u> using their DoE username and password, or can log into the site via the Student Portal. A video guide explaining how to use the Student Experience site can be found here.

How can students find books on the NSW PRC challenge lists?

There are specific shelves in our Library that house our PRC books. K-2 challenge books are on the red curved shelf, 3-4 challenge books on the green curved shelf and 5-6 challenge books on the dark blue curved shelf.


To enter a personal choice book:


