



School Bytes Parent Portal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Ringrose Public School is currently utilising the Sentral Parent Portal for communication and have communicated transitioning to School Bytes this term (Term 2). All correspondence will now be communicated digitally via School Bytes. We are going paperless. Permission requests will also need to be completed through the School Bytes app.

Our Parents and Carers will continue to retain the flexibility to make payments outside of school hours and will be able to receive and respond to communications at times that are most convenient for you.

The School Bytes Portal offers the following features:

Payments:

- The student's Statement of Account and payment reminders will be sent directly to parents/caregivers via email.
- You will receive emails from noreply@mail.schoolbytes.education.
- The Statement of Account email will include a "Make a Payment" button that directs you to the school's online payment portal.
- If there is a cost associated with an activity, the "Make a Payment" button will allow you to pay securely and easily using a credit or debit card (Visa and Mastercard only) after granting permission.

Correspondence, Notes and Permissions:

- All online forms, including permission notes, will be sent directly to you via School Bytes with an enclosed link. Click the link to access the secure online form.
- The online form will provide details about the activity and will include a section for your digital signature (using either a mouse or your finger) before submission.

We will continue to keep everyone well informed and updated with these changes. If you require assistance, please feel free to reach out to the school for assistance.

The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge is now open and Ringrose PS is excited to be participating!

What is the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge?

The PRC is a statewide Challenge that encourages students to develop a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students and enables them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition, but a challenge to encourage each student to read, to read more, and to read more widely.

All students who complete the challenge and have their reading record validated by the school's PRC coordinator will receive a certificate signed by the Premier of NSW.

How many books do students need to read?

Students in Kindergarten to Year 2 are challenged to read or experience 30 books. 20 of these books must be from the relevant Challenge booklists, and up to 10 books can be personal choice books. Books can be read with a parent, carer, teacher or another student.

Students in Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 20 books independently. At least 10 of these books must be from the relevant Challenge booklists, and up to 10 books can be personal choice books.

If a book is from an approved PRC series, students can enter up to 5 books as Challenge books, and can read up to 10 other books from the same series as Personal Choice books. More information on the rules of the Challenge can be found on the PRC website.

Books must be added to a student's online reading record by **Friday 22 August 2025** in order for their reading record to be validated and receive a certificate.

How do students log their reading?

Students can access the PRC's <u>Student Experience site</u> using their DoE username and password, or can log into the site via the Student Portal. A video guide explaining how to use the Student Experience site can be found here.

How can students find books on the NSW PRC challenge lists?

There are specific shelves in our Library that house our PRC books. K-2 challenge books are on the red curved shelf, 3-4 challenge books on the green curved shelf and 5-6 challenge books on the dark blue curved shelf.























Reconciliation Day, Prospect Hill


