### From the Deputy Principal's Desk

Dear Parents and Carers,

The last few weeks have been very busy and full of exciting events at our school! We recently celebrated Public Education Week, a special time dedicated to recognising the importance of public education in



providing quality learning opportunities for all students. It was wonderful to see such a great turn out for our assembly and open classrooms, where families had the chance to engage with our school community.

Last week, we enjoyed Book Week, highlighted by our fun-filled Book Parade. It's always fantastic to see our students and families embracing the spirit of the week with enthusiasm and creativity.

This week, we are acknowledging Anti-Bullying Week. Our students are participating in meaningful activities designed to explore strategies for kindness, respect, and creating a safe and supportive environment for everyone.

All of these events only happen because of our dedicated teachers, who generously spend their time organising these wonderful opportunities. Their hard work ensures our students have rich and memorable experiences throughout the year.

### Principal's Award

Students who earn 4 Gold Certificates will receive a Principal's Award, which can be achieved up to three times from Kindergarten to Year 6. This new award encourages consistent positive behaviour by recognising students' efforts over time.

For Year 5 and Year 6 students, we are offering a grace period this year. Year 5 students' achievements from last year, and Year 6 students' achievements from the past two years, will count towards earning the Principal's Award as we introduce this new system. However, for students in Kindergarten to Year 4, only Gold Certificates earned from this year onwards will count towards the award.

### **Supporting Online Safety for Children Aged 5 to 12**

As children begin to explore the online world more independently, they may encounter risks such as bullying, unsafe contact, inappropriate content, or overspending on apps. Your guidance is essential to help them navigate these challenges safely.

Tips for Parents and Carers:

- Keep devices in shared areas where you can supervise and regularly check what your child is viewing.
- Stay involved by exploring websites and apps together, and consider creating your own accounts to understand how they work.
- Respect your child's privacy but also use opportunities to discuss online risks and respectful behaviour.
- Encourage empathy by teaching children not to share or post content that could upset others.
- Build resilience by reassuring children they can always come to you or another trusted adult if they encounter worrying material.
- Be mindful of social media age limits—most require users to be at least 13.
- Use parental controls and child-friendly search engines to provide a safer online environment.
- Protect your own devices with passwords to prevent accidental access to inappropriate content.

If considering giving your child a personal device, review readiness and set clear rules. For more advice on talking about online safety and managing screen time, visit the Raising Children Network website.




I absolutely loved visiting 3/4B and can't wait to learn more things from them next time!

Overall, it was a fantastic day filled with fun, sportsmanship, teamwork, and school spirit.












