Whole School Messages

Social Media Age Restrictions - From 10 December 2025, many social media platforms will be required to prevent Australians under 16 from creating or maintaining accounts on certain age-restricted services. The changes aim to protect children from pressures and risks they can be exposed to while logged in to social media accounts.

The eSafety Commissioner is leading the implementation of the law. They are responsible for identifying platforms and supporting the community with information and resources.

Under-16s will still be able to see publicly available social media content that doesn't require logging into an account. There are no penalties for young people who use age-restricted platforms or for their parents and carers as the responsibility is with the platforms.

Important Safety Notice: Electric Scooters and Similar Devices - In line with keeping our children and families safe and complying with NSW law, electric scooters are banned and must not be brought onto school grounds. The NSW Police Force has provided us with important information, which is included in this newsletter. According to the information, "Devices such as electric scooters, skateboards, and hoverboards are illegal in NSW."

We kindly ask our school community to support this safety measure to ensure the wellbeing of all students and staff. Thank you for your cooperation.



Devices such as electric scooters, skateboards, and hoverboards are **ILLEGAL** in NSW.

Although a motorised scooter, skateboard, or hoverboard (electric or petrol powered) are considered motor vehicles, they do not satisfy the Australian Design Rules and for this reason, cannot be registered in NSW and are unable to be insured.

These devices cannot be ridden on roads, or road related areas (such as footpaths shared paths and cycleways) in NSW, except on private land.



Anyone caught riding a motorised device on a road or road related area in NSW can face fines starting from \$723

Remembrance Day

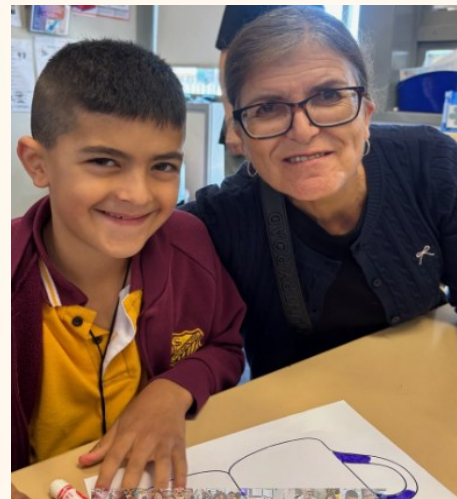

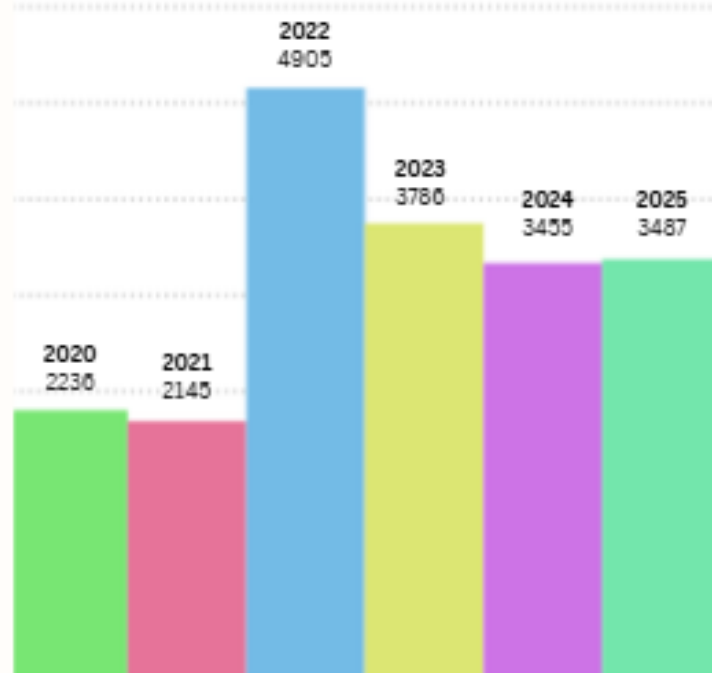
