E-bikes: safety tips


E-bikes: safety tips



As e-bikes become increasingly visible in our community, our young riders must understand the responsibilities of riding them. Ensuring safety on the roads is a shared responsibility, and we encourage all families to engage in conversations about e-bike safety.

Share these important safety tips:





Control your speed: E-bikes can reach higher speeds than traditional bikes, so it is vital to maintain a safe speed, especially in busy areas and around pedestrians. When riding on shared paths, slow down when passing pedestrians and give them plenty of space.

Know the rules of the road: Familiarise yourself with local traffic laws and regulations regarding e-bikes. Until the age of 16, e-bike riders are permitted to ride on the footpath unless signage says otherwise.

E-bikes: Use and storage on school grounds

E-bikes: Use and storage on school grounds



As e-bike use is growing in our community, it's important for our school to set clear directions for their use and storage on school grounds. These directions help keep everyone safe and maintain an organised environment.

Below are the specific guidelines for e-bike use and storage at our school:

Are students permitted to ride an e-bike to school?

Yes, students can ride a privately owned e-bike to school if it meets <u>Transport for NSW's</u>



There are two types of permitted e-bikes:
Power-assisted pedal cycles
Electrically power-assisted cycles The rider must propel these bikes- a motor can't be the only source propelling it and they cannot exceed 25 km/h.

Can e-bikes be charged on school grounds?

Charging of e-bike lithium-ion batteries is not permitted on school grounds



Can e-bikes be stored on school grounds?

Work, Health and Safety advice requires e-bikes to be stored in a location away from structures. This is aimed to minimise fire risks.

At our school, students are to store their e-bike (add in

E-bikes that don't comply with the TfNSW requirements will not be allowed to be stored on school grounds.

Do the same rules apply for e-scooters?

In NSW, it is illegal to ride a privately owned **e-scooter** on public roads or road-related areas including footpaths and cycle ways. **E-scooters are therefore not permitted on school grounds**.

E-BIKES: STORAGE ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

E-bikes may be stored on school grounds if they meet the requirements of TfNSW.

To minimise fire risks, they must be stored away from structures or buildings.

At our school they may be stored:
