League Gala Day

This was the turning point. The boys strapped the boots tighter, pulled the socks up to the knees, and said: *not today*. From the opening whistle, we ripped in—hard defence, barnstorming carries, and silky backline plays that had the crowd on their feet. Tanilba had no answers, and we put them to the sword 4–2. Pure dominance.

Post-match, Mr Bennett delivered a pep talk worthy of a State of Origin coach. He praised the effort, demanded more, and left the boys buzzing with belief.

Game Four vs Barnsley

The final showdown was against a Barnsley side stacked with big boppers who looked like they'd been bench-pressing tractors. But what they had in size, we matched with blistering speed and pure skill. We ran them ragged, carving up the edges and laying on some highlight-reel tries. The scoreboard lit up 5–2 in our favour, sealing a famous victory.

The Wrap-Up

At the end of the day, the boys finished with a 50% strike rate—two gutsy wins and two nail-biters that could've gone either way. More importantly, they left it all on the field in their final sports day of primary school. The heart, the spirit, and the pride they played with would've made any rugby league coach proud.
