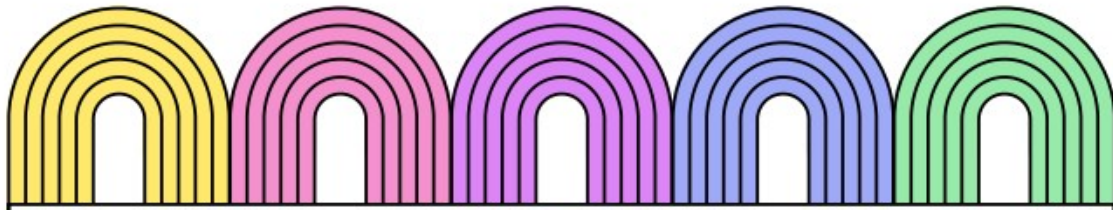

MATH

KR have been exploring the concept of area – the space inside a shape. We've drawn shapes on the concrete and created our own shapes using paddle pop sticks. In the activity pictured, we challenged ourselves to make shapes with a larger or smaller area than the one originally drawn.



LITERACY

KR have been taking part in daily partner reading to practise the sounds, words, and tricky words found in their decodable texts. Our Year 6 buddies have been supporting and guiding them during these sessions, helping build confidence and reading skills.

Students from Seaham Public School have recently undertaken, an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage, and democracy.
