### **First Nations Students**

#### **Cultural Immersion Day at Kimberwalli**

Our First Nations students recently participated in a cultural immersion day at Kimberwalli, the Western Sydney Aboriginal Centre for Excellence. This initiative aimed to deepen their cultural knowledge and experiences through hands-on activities and interactions with cultural practitioners.

In the commercial kitchens, students engaged in the preparation of traditional damper and sampled Johnny cakes with local honey, connecting with Indigenous culinary practices. The girls learned traditional dances from Jayde and Alkira Field, Gomeroi women renowned for sharing Indigenous dances and songs with young girls, ensuring the preservation of lore and practices. Meanwhile, the boys participated in storytelling sessions with Steve Trist, a Darug and Muruwari man, who imparted local Darug customs and taught them a traditional dance.

Jamie Eastwood, a Ngemba and Darug man and multidisciplinary artist, led a clapstick painting workshop. They combined traditional and non-traditional colours and imagery into the artworks, and the students took great pride in their creations.

Tarni Eastwood, a proud Ngiyampaa and Guringai woman and artist specializing in hand-dyed raffia and cultural workshops, guided students in the art of weaving to create pieces of raffia jewellery. This workshop provided students with a deeper understanding of their cultural heritage and traditions.

Through these experiences, students not only developed practical skills but also enhanced the appreciation for their cultural identity and developed community connections.


### Class Highlights




#### **Inclusive Education Multi-Sport Day**
