*NAPLAN = National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy. All students in **Years 3, 5**, 7 and 9 in Australia do NAPLAN tests in **March** each year. As students progress through their school years, it is important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process and it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with more information about students' educational progress.

Student achievement is shown against 4 levels of proficiency: Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs additional support.
