School News

UPDATE TO STUDENT PROGRESS REPORTS – INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

This year we are introducing updated school reports. The new format has been developed by the NSW Department of Education, in response to feedback from parents and educators to make reports easier to read and understand. A new achievement scale and descriptions are included to provide a clearer picture of your child's progress.

We have adopted the departments revised Effort Scale which can support family conversations about learning. See table below for specific details on each descriptor.

Description for parents and carers	Effort
Your child actively participates and engages in most learning activities. They always try to complete and present work to a high standard.	High
Your child actively participates and engages in most learning activities. They regularly try to complete and present work to the required standard.	Satisfactory
Your child sometimes participates and engages in learning activities. They occasionally try to complete and present work to the required standard.	Low

Your child's report will still show their progress in all subject areas. Teacher comments will appear in English, mathematics, and the general comment section, in line with department policy. Kindergarten

reports will contain information relating to all other key learning areas, including creative arts, HSIE, PDHPE, and science and technology.

In addition to reporting on student achievement, our school will report on the following areas for each student: whole school activities; attendance; social development and commitment to learning.

Parent-teacher interviews remain an important way to discuss your child's progress and achievement in more detail. Our annual formal parent-teacher interviews will be held early in Term 3 in Week 2 from Monday 28 July. Information on how to book online for parent-teacher interviews will be communicated with parents and carers in the coming weeks.

Strong communication with families supports learning. Between reporting periods, we encourage parents and carers to contact their child's class teacher at any time using informal channels, such as email, phone calls or a face-to-face meeting to discuss their child's progress and needs.

As per our usual reporting process, Semester 1 student progress reports will be published for parents and carers through the Parent Portal in School Bytes in Week 10 of Term 2.

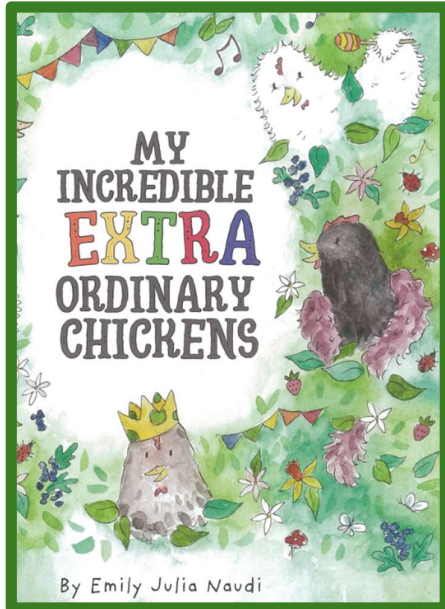

CHILDREN'S ONLINE PRIVACY CODE

The Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (OAIC), the Australian Government's privacy regulator, is seeking input from parents and carers to assist them in its development of the Children's Online Privacy Code (the Code).

The Code will put children at the center of privacy protections in Australia. By the time a child turns 13, it's estimated that 72 million pieces of data will have been collected about them. The aim of the Code is to strengthen privacy protections for the handling of children's personal information.

Your insights as a parent or carer are important.
