I am including a little snapshot of the opening of my Presentation Day speech from last Wednesday:

When I returned to SHPS this year, my intention was to slowly absorb the culture of this school and to ease my way back into this great school community by observing and finding my way. My intention was not to get slimed, or break my arm, but nevertheless, stuff happens.

What I have been able to observe and absorb I will share with you now.

Here are a few verbs to describe what our students do at SHPS on a daily basis:

Our students deliver, adjust, identify, apply, ask questions, experiment, reflect, record, represent, describe, analyse... and they do it while continuing to uphold our school values of respect, responsibility and excellence every day. And I really mean that they walk the walk around these three expectations for positive behaviour. We have the best students at SHPS!

Our school has a vision statement: Positive Relationships, High Expectations and Authentic Learning. What I have seen, heard and felt this year is as follows:

Positive Relationships

Looks like: Students and teachers engaging warmly with one another through smiles, eye contact, and open body language.

Sounds like: Friendly conversations, active listening, and respectful dialogue.

Feels Like: Safe, welcoming, and valuing all members of the school community.

High Expectations

Looks Like: Students actively engaged and focused on tasks that challenge their abilities.

Sounds Like: Constructive feedback aimed at improving performance and understanding.

Feels like: Empowering, fostering a growth mindset among students and staff.

Authentic Learning

Looks Like: Opportunities for students to explore interests and apply knowledge creatively.

Sounds Like: Students expressing curiosity and ownership of their learning.

Feels like: Empowering students to be active participants in their own learning journey.

Staff Movements 2026

Mrs Erica Elloy will be taking leave in 2026. Miss Chelsea Drury will be departing SHPS, to pursue her career closer to home. Mrs Rebecca Power will also be leaving SHPS, as her family are relocating. I would like to thank Mrs Power for all her hard work in our school over a number of years. She has been a stalwart for our staff and has a very strong relationship with all students across the school, she will be missed!

Several of our staff will be in part time positions in 2026, so we are actively seeking to recruit several new teachers into temporary positions for next year. I will keep the community posted about these roles as they are finalised.

Ms Huntley will be working in the APCI role five days a week, meaning she won't be committed to a class, rather she will be coaching and mentoring staff and overseeing the regular focus on student growth in reading and numeracy. Mrs Partridge will continue in her role as APCI three days per week.

Our school recently recruited a new Assistant Principal to replace Mrs Emma Kelly, for 2026 and beyond. Mrs Lana Mulholland will be joining our school as the Stage 2 (Year 3 and 4) Assistant Principal next year. Please join me in welcoming Mrs Mulholland to the role.

More information will be provided on the Sentral Parent Portal about teachers and grades, but there will be some significant movements of staff across stages and grades, from what they are teaching this year.

2026 Start to School

In Term 1 2026, staff will participate in four Staff Development Days, from Tuesday, 27th January, to Friday, 30th January.

All students will start back at school on Monday, 2nd February 2026.

Kindergarten students and families will receive a note stipulating the time that their child will start school, with minor staggering of student arrivals, to avoid a crowded classroom, and to give time for students to settle.

Students in Year 1 to 6 will line up in their class lines from 2025, in the same place they would meet in 2025. Students moving from Year 2 to Year 3, and Year 4 to Year 5, will then be escorted by staff to the new area for them to be allocated their 2026 classes.
