Dear Parents and Carers,

SOCIAL MEDIA AWARENESS

As technology becomes an integral part of children's daily lives, it is crucial for us, as parents, carers, and teachers, to ensure that their online activities are safe and appropriate. Inappropriate use of technology, such as smartphones, iPads, laptops, and other computers, can pose risks to children.

Children under the age of 13 should not be using or accessing social media apps such as Facebook, Snapchat, TikTok, and Instagram. These platforms can expose children to offensive content, including inappropriate language and images. Such experiences can negatively impact their wellbeing and that of their peers.

To help mitigate these risks, I strongly urge you to take the following actions:

- Regular Monitoring: Regularly check your child's device usage, including the apps they are using and the content they are engaging with.
- Open Communication: Have honest conversations with your child about appropriate social media use, educating them on potential dangers and the importance of responsible online behaviour.
- **Set Boundaries:** Establish clear rules for internet use, such as time limits and restrictions on certain apps or websites, and encourage device use in common areas of the home.
- Parental Controls: Utilise parental control features available on devices and apps to manage and monitor your child's online activities
- **Stay Informed:** Keep yourself updated on the latest social media trends and associated risks to better guide and protect your child.

SEMESTER 1 REPORTS

Teachers are finalising Semester 1 reports, which will be sent home next Wednesday. I am currently reading each report and am proud of the achievements our students have made this year.

From this term we're introducing updated reports. The new format has been developed by the NSW Department of Education in response to feedback from parents and teachers to make reports easier to read and understand. Your child's report will still show their progress across all subject areas and in Years 1 – 6, there are teacher comments in the English, Mathematics and the General Comment sections, in line with department policy. Kindergarten students will receive a comment for each Key Learning Area, as well as a general comment. Those who have English as an Additional Language or Dialect will also receive a comment. Comments will include student strengths and areas where improvements can be made.

Achievement

For students in Year 1 to Year 6, a five-point achievement scale comparing your child against statewide syllabus standards (not against other students) is used:

- Outstanding (A)
- High (B)
- Sound (C)
- Basic (D)
- Limited (E)

In Kindergarten, students do not receive an assessment rating.

Effort

A three-point effort scale is used for all students:

- High
- Satisfactory
- Low

A student who receives a **SOUND** (**C**) achievement has met the general expectations. A **HIGH** (**B**) or **OUTSTANDING** (**A**) level indicates that a student has exceeded expectations, while a **BASIC** (**D**) or **LIMITED** (**E**) level means a student has not yet achieved the expected standards. As you read your child's report, please celebrate their achievements. If you would like to discuss the report with their classroom teacher, please reach out to arrange a convenient time.

If you do not receive your child's report next Wednesday, please contact the school as soon as possible.

ATTENDANCE

Research shows that good attendance is essential for helping students reach their full potential. At Smithfield West, the attendance team, led by Ms. Fleming, is doing an excellent job promoting attendance. I am pleased to report that our average daily attendance rate currently sits at 93.1%, which puts us well above both the state and Fairfield Network averages.

Well done, everyone, and keep up the good work!

COLD WEATHER - SCHOOL UNIFORM

As we head into the cooler months, it is important for students to stay warm. However, some students are opting for jackets, jumpers, and hats that do not comply with our school uniform policy. Please remember that all students should wear their Smithfield West jacket/jumper and school hat each day. The sun's rays can still pose a risk during winter, and we must prioritise skin safety year-round.

WETHERILL STREET PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

I would like to remind parents and carers about the importance of crossing Wetherill Street at the traffic lights and waiting for the green pedestrian light. I have observed many people running across this busy road against the lights, which is dangerous and sets a poor example for children.

Some parents and carers have mentioned that the traffic lights have a long cycle. After contacting Service NSW, we were assured that this is not the case. Therefore, there is no reason not to do the right and safe thing.

I urge everyone to cross at the traffic lights.

STUDENT ASSISTANCE

Times are challenging for many families, and I want to ensure that all students can participate in the experiences we provide. If you are having difficulty paying for any school activity, including excursions, please reach out to me. I want to ensure that no child misses out on the opportunities we offer.

SAFE PEOPLE, SAFE PLACES

Child safety is paramount, both at school and home. Here are some strategies we teach at school that you might like to reinforce at home:

- Ensure your parents or another trusted adult know where you are always. Always walk straight home or to your destination, using footpaths near busy roads.
- Be aware of safe places, such as shops, service stations, police stations, libraries, or schools. If you feel frightened, go to one of these places and ask for help.
- Learn about safe adults you can approach for assistance, such as police officers or trusted teachers.
- Do not interact with strangers or get into a car with someone you do not know. If a car stops and you do not know the person inside, do not stop.
- If you feel scared and have access to a phone, call Triple Zero (000) and explain your situation.
- If someone tries to grab you, yell out, "Go away, I don't know you!" This will alert others to your situation.
