Year 10 Senior Subject Selection

Throughout Term 3, our Year 10 students have participated in a series of structured events designed to support informed and thoughtful decisions regarding their future pathways and senior subject selection for 2026. We are proud of the professional and mature approach they have demonstrated throughout each stage of this process.

The program commenced with the 'Brand Me' Preparation for Subject Selection Workshops, where students rotated through for targeted sessions:

- Resume writing developing a professional and effective resume
- Dress for success understanding the importance of appropriate presentation for interviews
- Interview skills building the confidence and techniques in an interview setting
- Senior Interview Day preparation practising the skills required for their interviews

This was followed by the **Subject Selection Information Evening**, where parents and students received important information from NESA and UAC on HSC requirements, eligibility, the RoSA credential, and the ATAR. Students then participated in the **Senior Subject Fair**, engaging in workshops that showcased the curriculum offerings available for senior studies. The series of events culminated in the **Senior Interview Day**, where students presented themselves with confidence and professionalism in one-on-one interviews with staff. During these interviews, they had the opportunity to discuss their aspirations and finalise their subject selections.

We look forward to welcoming Year 10 into senior school as part **EX-10-SION** in Term 4.

Year 11 Preliminary Examinations

Our Year 11 students will be undertaking their Preliminary Examinations in Weeks 9 and 10. It is essential that students are present for all scheduled examinations. If a student is unable to attend due to illness or other valid circumstances, they must complete an **Illness/Misadventure Form** and provide appropriate documentation, such as a medical certificate to the Faculty Head Teacher.

Important reminders:

- Students must be in full school uniform and arrive 15 minutes prior to the scheduled exam time
- Bring all required stationery in a clear pencil case or plastic sleeve
- Mobile phones and ear pods must be switched off and stored in school bags
- Do not bring paper or printed notes into the exam room
- Smart watches are not permitted

The timetable will be distributed to students in the coming weeks. We wish all of our Year 11 students the very best as they prepare for and complete this important stage of their senior studies.






Year 7 English - Drama Text of Study

Our Year 7 students kicked off the week by exploring Aboriginal symbols and culture through the drama text, Honey Spot. A powerful start to recognising and celebrating First Nation voices through storytelling and the arts.

















Year 7 Science - Aboriginal Ochre

As part of their South Coast geology studies, our Year 7 students explored the cultural and geological significance of Gulaga.

Gulaga, an extinct volcano, is a sacred site and the place of ancestral origin for the Yuin people. Symbolising the mother, Gulaga provides a strong spiritual foundation for Aboriginal women and men, embodying deep connection to land and Country.

Students created their own ochre paints using crushed mineral-based rocks in traditional colours - white, red, yellow, and black - and produced artworks that reflect their personal understanding of connection to land and Country. An engaging and meaningful experience that blended science, art, and culture.

















Year 8 English - Text Study

Our Year 8 students are learning about the Stolen Generations through the powerful text, They Took the Children Away by Archie Roach. A moving and important exploration of truth, history, and the resilience of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.


