All students have had a settled and happy commencement to the year, and I commend you, as parents, for helping make this transition so smooth. It has been such an exciting first week. Our classrooms are buzzing with engaging learning activities and our playground is full of happy smiles and laughter. What a great start to 2025.

Our Kindergarten 2025 will participate in the Best Start Kindergarten Assessment over the next few weeks with feedback information to parents shortly afterwards. The assessment is not a test but provides teachers with useful information to help support each child's learning at school.


