K-1 News - Mrs Everton

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Welcome to Term 4! We are excited for a busy and fun-filled term as we continue our learning journey. Here's what your child will be experiencing this term:

Swimming Program

This term, our Kindergarten students will participate in a swimming program designed to build water confidence and introduce basic swimming skills. Further information will be provided as the term progresses.

Preparation for End of Year Concert

We are beginning rehearsals for our annual End of Year Concert. The children will be learning songs, dances, and simple performances to showcase their talents. More details about the concert date and costume requirements will be shared soon.

Consolidation of Reading, Writing, and Spelling Skills

Our focus will be on strengthening foundational literacy skills. Students will engage in activities to consolidate their reading fluency, writing confidence, and spelling accuracy.

Numeracy Skills Development

We will continue to develop essential numeracy skills through hands-on activities and games. The children will explore number recognition, counting, simple addition and subtraction, and problem-solving strategies with grouping.

Additional Term 4 Highlights

- *Science and Nature Exploration:* We will explore seasonal changes in our environment, learning about plants, weather, and animals through hands-on experiments and observations. An excursion will be included this term.
- *Creative Arts and Craft:* Students will engage in a variety of creative projects, including painting, drawing, and crafting, especially focusing on themes from English.

- *Social Skills and Wellbeing:* Emphasis on teamwork, resilience, and kindness through group activities in a Peer support programme and discussions to help children prepare for their transition to Year 1.
- *Technology Integration:* Age-appropriate use of technology to support learning, such as Reading Eggs, Fast phonics and Maths seeds will be used to reinforce literacy and numeracy.

We look forward to a wonderful Term 4 full of learning and celebration. Thank you for your ongoing support!



2-3 News - Mrs Taylor

This term, our Reading Groups will continue with support from our SLSO (School Learning Support Officer). We will focus on developing key reading skills to improve decoding and deepen comprehension. Students will work on reading fluently and using strategies such as identifying the main idea, summarising, and self-monitoring their understanding. To support their responses to texts, students will practise notetaking and writing summaries.

During Modelled Reading, we'll explore a range of texts that showcase important literary themes, including making judgements, representation, symbolism, and character development.

Mathematics

Students will continue to develop and apply a variety of mental strategies for addition, subtraction, and multiplication, selecting the most efficient method for each task. This term's focus will include topics such as position, area, money, volume, and capacity, using formal measurement units like metres, centimetres, millimetres, grams, kilograms, litres, and millilitres. We'll also revisit multiplication, division, and fractions to consolidate and extend students' understanding.

Writing

Students will strengthen their grammar skills to craft purposeful and cohesive sentences. We will focus on using prepositional phrases, conjunctions, and cause-and-effect structures. Writing tasks will include visual posters with infographics, personal narratives representing students' own lives, and persuasive texts inspired by our modelled reading.

Creative Arts

We will explore dance to represent cultural understanding of Australian life. Students will be learning a dance routine and rehearsing a dance to the song "Eagle Rock", which they will perform as part of the Tarago Performing Arts Concert in Week 9.



Sport / PE

This term, students will participate in Swimming lessons in Week 7. On Fridays, I will lead PE lessons focused on developing fundamental movement skills related to sports like basketball, cricket, and T-ball. Students will practise catching, throwing, receiving, and working as part of a team.

Personal Development

This term in Stage 1 Personal Development, students will focus on Child Protection and take part in the Peer Support Program. They will learn about safe and unsafe situations, body boundaries, and identifying trusted adults. The program aims to build confidence and help-seeking skills. Through Peer Support, students will participate in activities led by older peers that promote teamwork, resilience, and respectful relationships, helping to create a safe and supportive school environment.

Geography

Students will explore the natural and built features of different places and understand how these exist across various scales. They will describe how spaces can be arranged and used for different purposes, both locally and globally.

Science

Students will first learn to identify the components of digital systems and understand how data is represented and transmitted. They will then explore how materials can be changed or combined, with a focus on how heat causes changes in states of matter through particle vibrations.

Miss Taylor's Long-Service Leave

This term, I will be taking four weeks of long service leave from Week 5 to Week 9. During my absence, Mrs Helen Mulholland will be teaching 2/3T. She is well-acquainted with our school and brings a wealth of teaching experience. The class will be in very capable hands.

4-5-6 News - Mr McCartney

ENGLISH

Reading - A wide variety of texts is very important for improvement in fluency and comprehension. Even MORE important is for students to READ EVERY day. Our class completes Reading Groups 4 days per week which includes daily oral reading in groups, reading a magazine and writing a review of one article per week, reading a comprehension card and answering questions once per week and completing Reading Eggspress activities each week. Students borrow library books every Friday which they are encouraged to read in class each afternoon in USR (uninterrupted silent reading).

Novel Study – this term, we will continue studying a recommended text called “WONDER”. We will focus on character development and use of language to create engagement for the reader.
Writing – Students regularly write weekly journal entries, respond to specific writing tasks from our novel study and practice handwriting. Students will also practice their persuasive writing skills with Mr G on Tuesdays. During the week, students will also be writing informative texts with Mr Mac.

Spelling – The class will continue to study important spelling rules in our Sound Waves program. During the first 5 weeks we will study ‘y’, ‘oo’ and ‘z’, ‘ou’, ‘sh’ and ‘oi’. Our Sound Waves program also revises suffixes, prefixes, synonyms, antonyms and improving vocabulary.
MATHS – The first 5 weeks of term will see students focus on mental arithmetic skills across all areas of Maths using a new program called FACTS ON FIRE. This program drills speed and accuracy on simple then more complex addition, subtraction, multiplication and division algorithms. Our areas of study for the main part of our maths lessons will be – addition, subtraction, division and multiplication algorithms, mass, volume, area, length, time, data, angles, decimals and percentages.

PD/PE/Sport: Our Sport program will focus on basketball skills and cricket skills this term. We will also revise athletics skills in preparation for the Taralga Sports Day this week.

Geography – This term, our unit is called “Natural Disasters”. Students will study the occurrence of natural disasters, the causes and the management of them.

Science – Ms Berry will be teaching the unit entitled “Changing Matter” on Mondays which asks students to investigate the question - How can the state of materials be changed and manipulated?

Technology – Mr G will be teaching a Technology unit on Tuesdays using Minecraft Education to sharpen student use of creating worlds according to criteria set by the teacher.

Creative Arts – Ms Berry will be teaching a unit on visual arts this term on Mondays to study various famous artists and experiment with techniques used by these artists.

END OF YEAR CONCERT – Students will be auditioning for a K-6 play we will present at the end of the term, called BACK TO THE SUMMER. Once roles are filled, rehearsals will begin with lines to learn, musical performances to practice and props to be built and painted.









Child Protection- Term 4

This term all students K-6 will continue to be involved in the mandatory subject Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE).

Part of our school's PDHPE program includes mandatory child protection education which will be taught this term. Some of the content taught in child protection education deals with sensitive issues. The school will teach this content in an age appropriate way. If you would like information about the specific content which will be covered in child protection this term please contact your child's teacher.
