# Stronger connections, higher attendance – Taree Public School's success story

Taree Public School (Biripi Country) is building strong foundations through a culturally grounded approach to education. With more than half of its students identifying as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander, the school has proudly been part of the <u>Connected Communities Strategy</u> since 2014.

Central to its success is the school's Culture and Caring program, which embraces Biripi culture and includes Gathang language lessons for all students. This commitment to cultural connection is underpinned by the values of safety, respect and engagement.

The results speak for themselves. In Term 1 2025, overall student attendance was 89.1% – and that of Aboriginal students reached 89.6%.

Strong culture and community are helping to drive better engagement across the board, with students showing growth in reading and numeracy, expectations for success and sense of belonging.

Congratulations students and thank you to our parents/carers, teachers and all staff for prioritising attendance!
