INTRODUCTION

Tharawal Public School opened in February 1986.

The name Tharawal is from the traditional Aboriginal owners of this land. The Lyrebird was their totem. **RESPECT and RESPONSIBILITY** was chosen as the school's motto.

Tharawal Public School caters for Kindergarten to Year 6 students. The principal is responsible for the administration of the whole school, with the assistance of all staff.

Wet Weather

All students remain under covered walkways. If there is heavy rain or extreme weather, all students will be supervised in their own classrooms.

Newsletter

Our online newsletter ***Tharawal Tales*** is published and emailed fortnightly. This is a vital, regular source of communication, keeping you informed of what is happening at the school.

Library

All students have full access to the school library and are expected to use a library bag for borrowing books. Clearly label the library bag with your child's name and class. All kindergarten students will receive their library bag as a welcoming gift. The P&C has funded this initiative.

Students will be told their library day when school begins.



Parents & Citizens' Association (P&C)

The P&C represents the entire school community, and all parents are encouraged to attend meetings, held each term. These meetings take place on Tuesdays - Weeks 3 and 8, starting at 7pm and are offered in a hybrid format (both via an online platform and in-person). The P&C provides an opportunity for parents to stay informed about educational matters, contribute to school decisions, participate in fundraising efforts, and engage in social events.

Family Contributions

As a public school there are no compulsory fees. However, funds available to our school from government sources are limited, so a voluntary contribution is requested from each family to help provide a range of equipment and materials needed for students such as I-pads. Voluntary contributions are added to students accounts.

School Attendance

Our school follows the Department of Education Attendance Policy and Procedures – link found [here](#)

Absence: Parents are required to call or email the school or send a note of explanation to the class teacher. Should you need to take your child during school hours please call the office in advance so we can notify the class teacher.

Late Arrivals: Students who arrive at school after 9.00am should go to the front office to get a "Late Slip" to be given to their classroom teacher. If you do not go to the office your child could be marked absent for the day.

Regular late arrivals are followed up by the Home School Liaison Officer, as are regular absences.



Student Leave: If families are planning to take their children out of school for an extended holiday of 5 or more school days, **parents are required to complete an *Application for extended leave-travel*** form which will be provided to the Principal for leave approval. The application may be collected any time from the front office.

Uniforms

All students at Tharawal Public School are to wear full school uniform.

Included in this booklet is a detailed list of uniform requirements. All items are available at the school's P&C run uniform shop.

A P&C parent volunteer fills the orders on Wednesday mornings. Orders and payments can be made using the QKR app only. Orders are handed out in class to your child.

PREPARING YOUR CHILD FOR KINDERGARTEN

Strategies to help your child prepare for school.

- Talk to your child about school in a positive way - it is important that children feel happy about starting school.
- Buy clothing and shoes that are easy to put on and take off.
- Label all items your child will bring to school: a school bag, lunchboxes, drink bottle, and hat.

Teach your child to:

- use the toilet, blow their own nose, and wash hands,
- share and take turns,
- care for toys and books,
- look after their own belongings,
- listen and carry out instructions.



Also try and let your child get used to:

- playing with groups of children of a similar age.
- Staying at friends or relatives houses for a few hours without you,
- Helping with small jobs around the house such as wiping benches, washing up, putting clothes away. Most children enjoy doing responsible things.

Remember to:

- Talk about the length of a school day in a way your child will understand and prepare him/her for the experience of a whole day at school.
- Also talk about the difference between 'playtimes' and 'lunch times.' Show your child what food you have packed and say when you expect it to be eaten.

Student class requirements will be sent home each year by your class teacher.

A school bag for everyday that is big enough to hold a lunch box, reading folder and other personal items that are necessary. Put your child's name on it. Let your child practise opening and closing it before starting school.

Money

The Canteen operates Monday to Friday.

- Please do not give your child large sums of money.
- Snacks can be purchased over the counter at recess and lunch.
- Lunch orders are to be purchased via the QKR app.
- Please change your child's class on the app at the beginning of each school year.

Students cannot share food with other students.

Daily food example:

Crunch & Sip - Fresh fruit and vegetables only. **Recess** - A piece of fruit and a packet of chips.

Lunch - Sandwiches, a piece of fruit and a drink (plastic).

Nut Allergies:

As we currently have students who have severe nut allergies, we strongly encourage students not to bring Nutella, peanut butter or products containing nuts into the school. Exposure to these foods may cause a severe anaphylactic reaction in these students, which could be a life-threatening situation.





Kindergarten Aim

The first year of formal schooling in kindergarten is to establish cooperative social skills, sound learning habits, acceptable class and group behaviours and to lay the foundations for all subject areas with the emphasis on early literacy and numeracy. Activities and strategies designed by our Kindergarten teachers develop the students in all facets of social, emotional, physical and academic growth.

Favourite toys

These are best left at home as they may get lost or damaged. The school does not take responsibility for lost or damaged items.

BE PREPARED TO 'LET GO' - when your child is taken to his/her classroom. If you are upset, do not let your child see this. Most students settle readily when the day's routine begins.

PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING CAREFULLY REGARDING AFTERNOON PICK UP ARRANGEMENTS

Kindergarten students should not leave the kindergarten classroom/area until a parents or guardian collects them. Students should not walk on their own to meet parents at other exits unless an older brother or sister collects them at the student's classroom.

IF YOU CANNOT COLLECT YOUR CHILD.

If someone else will be collecting your child, you must provide written permission in advance to your class teacher or email the school. Please call the school if circumstances change throughout the day and pick up arrangements change.

Any student not collected from the classroom will be taken to the office. The office will contact you and if you cannot pick up your child by 3:15 pm, your child will be booked into Before and After School Care for the afternoon. Parents will be charged the casual day rate.

We are sure you understand the need for these procedures as the safety and welfare of your child is paramount.

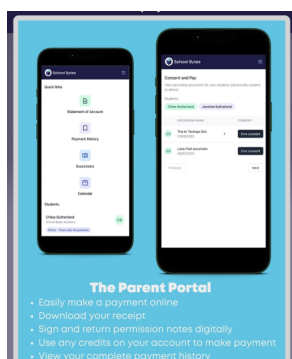


Payments for excursion/incursions are processed through the school bytes Parent Portal.

School bytes. Parents will receive an email to give permission online and make any payments through the link in the email.

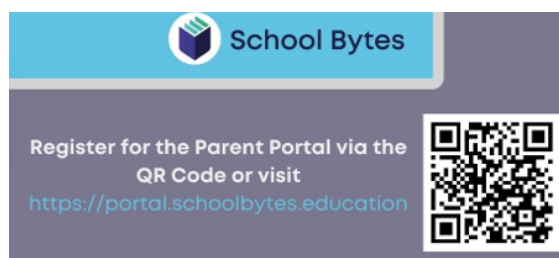
Permission notes are required by the due dates. This enables us to confirm numbers for the venue and buses.

2. **Canteen lunch orders** can only be ordered through the QKR app and must be ordered **before** 9.00am.

Please note that on Fridays, only Friday Fun packs are available to order for lunch.

The P&C has a formal lease agreement with the principal and runs our canteen.

A percentage of the profits are donated to the school each year to support school activities.

Occasionally a student comes to school without a lunch order or money. If the excuse is genuine, a lunch will be made up and an IOU will be sent home with the child.

You can purchase a Sticky Beaks sustainable lunch bag to use for lunches for \$12.50.

Students are expected to be well mannered and polite when using the canteen.

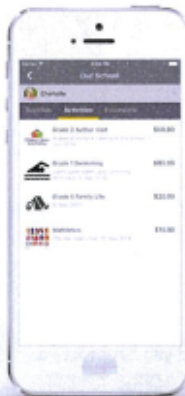

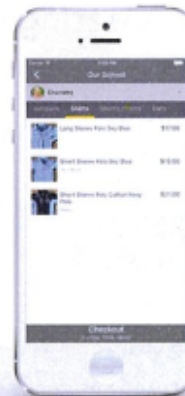

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE COUNCIL (SRC)

The role of the SRC is to provide students with a voice in school decision making. It allows for students to give opinions and make suggestions about things happening at school. It also increases student leadership opportunities. The SRC consists of two representatives from each class Kindergarten to Year 6 elected by peers at the beginning of each school year.

WEEKLY RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION

Voluntary religious instruction teachers attend the school each Tuesday. The lessons that are presented have the approval of the Department of Education. Subject to the availability of religious instruction teachers, Combined Christian, Catholic and Orthodox classes are provided. Arrangements are made for those students who do not attend religious instruction.

EXCURSIONS AND CULTURAL PERFORMANCES

Educational excursions e.g. field trips, overnight camps etc are an integral part of this school's curriculum, and all students are expected to attend. However, students demonstrating inappropriate/unsatisfactory behaviour may not be permitted to take part.

- Social development through group interaction

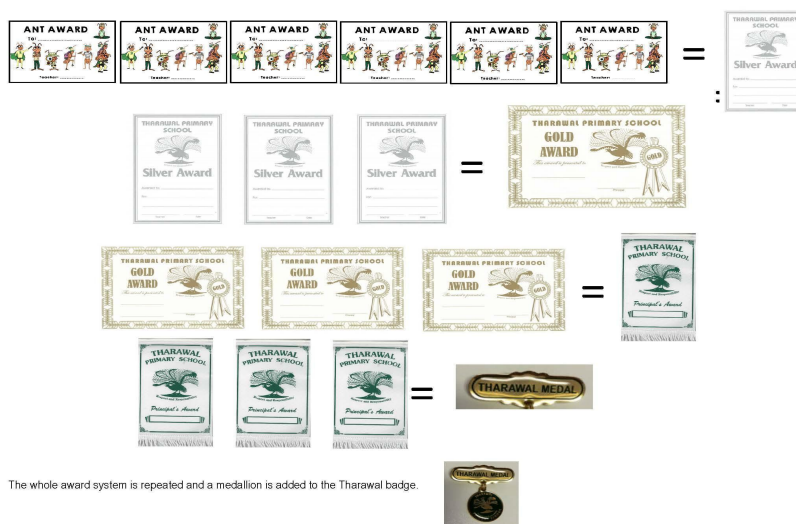


STRATEGIES TO PROMOTE POSITIVE SELF DISCIPLINE

In our efforts to guide students toward self-discipline, we utilise various methods to positively reinforce correct and acceptable behaviour. To support teachers in this endeavour, the school has implemented a **School Award System**.

Class-level positive recognition systems are integrated into the School Award System, with each class teacher maintaining their own individual reward system.

Ant awards are given to the class teacher. All other awards are to be placed in the white box marked “office” located in the playground, attached to the Administration building wall.



STUDENT WELLBEING AND SUPPORT AT THARAWAL PUBLIC SCHOOL

LEARNING AND SUPPORT TEAM (LST)

The Learning and Support Team (LST) is responsible for identifying students who may require a differentiated teaching and learning program including both HPGE students and students who are experiencing difficulties. Teachers refer students to the LST, this is made up of the Principal, School Counsellor, Learning and Support Teacher. The team arranges classroom observations and meetings with parents to discuss strategies to support the student as well as the student's progress.

Parents are kept informed and are invited to meet with the LST to ensure that the necessary support for their child is effectively provided.

SCHOOL COUNSELLOR

The school counsellor is in attendance one day per week. Her role is to provide a service to students, parents and teachers, with respect to student learning and behaviour.

Teachers refer students experiencing learning or behavioural difficulties to the Learning and Support Team. The team arranges classroom observations and meetings with parents to discuss the student's progress. The school counsellor also attends these meetings to provide advice and support. To fully assess the situation, the school counsellor may conduct diagnostic tests and have one-on-one discussions with the student. Parents are required to complete and sign a counsellor referral form to grant permission before any meetings or assessments take place.

Parents are kept well informed and are invited to meet with the school counsellor.

SCHOOL WELLBEING AND SUPPORT OFFICER – SWSO

This program is designed to complement all aspects of school life, with a particular focus on student welfare initiatives and supporting student wellbeing. Participation is voluntary, and parental permission is required through a referral.

THARAWAL BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE (TBASC)



Tharawal Before and After School Care (TBASC) is managed by the Tharawal Parents and Citizens Association (P&C). TBASC is proudly not-for-profit, which means our primary focus is to provide high-quality, cost-effective care.

Our goal is to ensure that children have access to resources and experiences that make their time enjoyable while being supported by skilled and experienced educators who are actively involved in the Tharawal School community.

Tharawal Before and After School Care was established in 1989 by a group of parents to meet the needs of families who were working or studying and has grown to a 90-place service. It is managed by parents and families of the P&C, who assist the Director and Centre Manager in making informed decisions about the operation of the service.

PARKING

Parents dropping off or collecting children from TBASC is **ONLY** available on school grounds **BEFORE** 8.30am and **AFTER** 3.30pm Monday to Friday. **Parent parking is not permitted on school grounds at any other time.**



SAFETY OF CHILDREN

Be sure your child knows the safety rules for our busy streets. Show your child how to cross the street safely.

The Gerald Road and Blaxland Drive entrances have crossings to provide safety for the students of Tharawal Public School.

Please avoid parking in dangerous spots, double-parking or using the car park as a pick-up or deposit area. Also, No Parking in the bus zone.

Close co-operation with the police and Sutherland Council assists in ensuring that the local regulations are complied with.



OPAL CARDS

Bus Travel to and from school

All Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to free bus travel. For students entering Year 3 to Year 6 the Department of Transport requires that an **application for an Opal card be made online at transportnsw.info/school-students**



To be eligible for free travel (for Years 3 to 6) students must reside more than 1.6 kilometres (radial distance) from the school.

HEALTH CARE PLANS

Electronic information is compiled according to information you have entered on your child's enrolment form. If your child suffers any physical or health issues, the school requires you to provide information from your medical practitioner. E.g. – Anaphylaxis Plan signed by the doctor.

Medication

Parents of students with conditions that require regular medication must advise the school of the child's condition by giving office staff written information about the condition provided by the doctor. The school where appropriate, will develop an individual health care plan in consultation with the parent and doctor.

If your child needs medicine on a short-term basis you must attend the office and complete the *Request for Administering Prescribed Medication form*. All medication must be administered from the office by the office staff apart from asthma puffers.

All prescription medication to be administered at school is to be brought to school by an adult in its original container, with the prescription label clearly visible.

Please note that paracetamol is NOT kept at school.

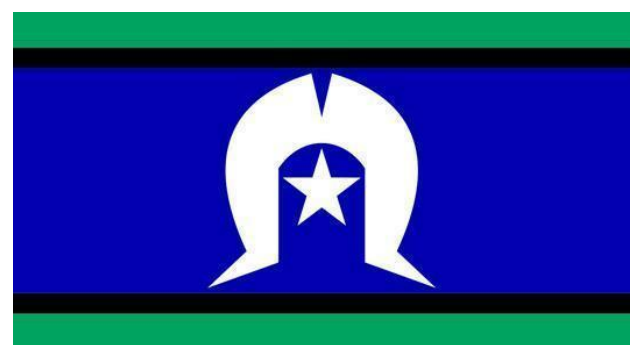
