Each Thursday lunchtime during Terms 2 and 3, 20 dedicated Stage 3 mathematicians have been sharpening their problem-solving skills as participants in the Junior Division Olympiad (APSMO), a prestigious inter-school competition designed specifically for high potential and high achieving students in Years 5 and 6.

The competition comprises of four separate contests held approximately six weeks apart, beginning in early Term 2. During each contest, students are required to solve five challenging problems within 30 minutes under exam conditions, with no collaboration permitted.

Our students have embraced this exciting challenge with great enthusiasm and determination. They have completed all four contests with admirable focus, resilience, and creativity, demonstrating not only their strong mathematical abilities but also their perseverance and love for learning. Following each contest, students engage in group review sessions to discuss solutions, further enhancing their understanding and fostering teamwork.

Congratulations to all our Stage 3 participants — your hard work and success are an inspiration to the entire school community. Participants will be formally recognised at the next school assembly on Tuesday, 4th November. We look forward to supporting your continued growth and success in future competitions.




