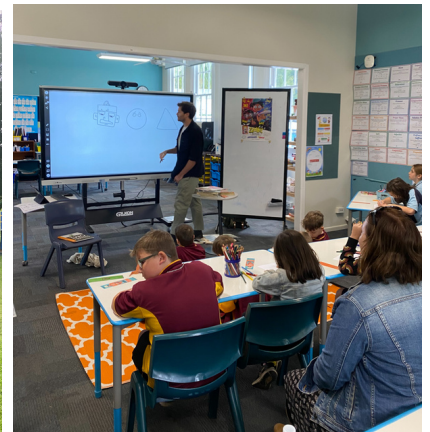
Healthy Harold at The Risk PS

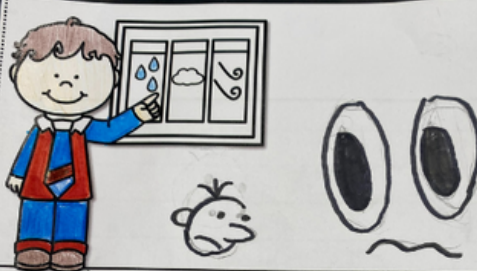

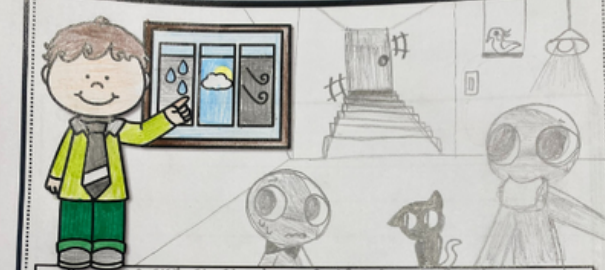

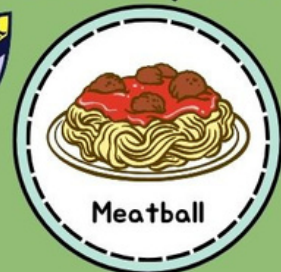
