Supporting Safe and Respectful Bus Travel

We are continuing to address behaviour challenges on the Murphy's bus to town, and today marked an important step forward. Our school joined with Wiangaree Public School and bus driver Ray to deliver a special bus travel lesson, focusing on the importance of safe and respectful behaviour while travelling to and from school.

As part of this session, students were guided through the Code of Conduct for Safe Bus Travel, including a clear explanation of the expectations and consequences for inappropriate behaviour. Our goal is to ensure every student feels safe and supported during their journey.

We kindly ask that families continue this conversation at home. Some important topics to discuss with your child include:

- · Staying seated at all times
- · Wearing a seatbelt correctly
- · Speaking in a calm, quiet voice
- Ignoring distracting or silly behaviour

If you have concerns about your child's safety on the bus, please contact the bus company or the school directly. We remind families that adults should not approach children to address behavioural concerns.








Junior Room
