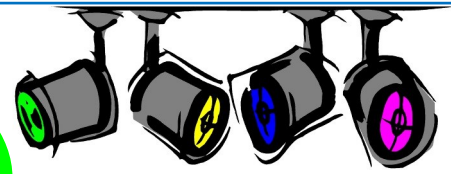

SPOTLIGHT ON 3/4/5/6



At the end of Term, 1 3/4/5/6 were playing with the primary colours from the colour wheel. Experimenting in combining the primary colours to make new colours. Lots of learning moments come from experimenting.

Using Drafts in our writing.

The class had to change the ending of a story. They had to make sure they included different sentence structures to make their writing interesting and engage the reader. The process took a while as we had to learn it was not only okay to make mistakes but also add more interesting ideas into their story.

Once their story was finished, they then had to read it and fix any errors. They added more adjectives in.

They would rewrite it if it was getting too messy.

This process could have been repeated up to 5 times.

Once the students were happy with their work, they typed and illustrated it, making sure their illustrations matched their words.

One students final edit read...

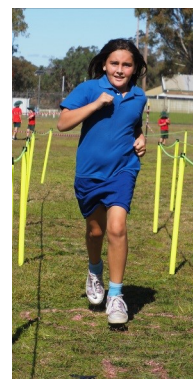
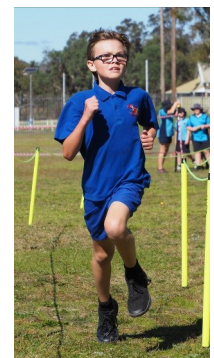
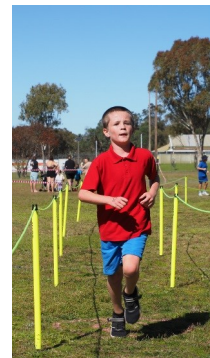
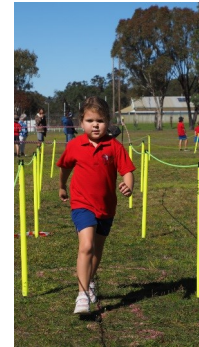
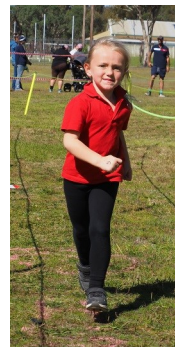
End of Term 1 25ers

Regular school attendance

For children to learn and grow at their best they need a night time routine to ensure they get enough sleep so they can concentrate on their learning in class and make good decisions with their behaviour. Teachers have noticed that a number of students have been coming to school extremely tired, even to the point of needing a sleep during the day. It is important that you support your child/children in getting enough sleep every night.

Age Group	Recommended Sleep
Preschool (ages 3 to 5)	10-13 hours
Elementary School (ages 6 to 13)	9-11 hours
High School (ages 14 to 17)	8-10 hours
