Principal's message

They have handled the challenges of new subjects, new teachers and a new level of independence with determination and positivity. School Swimming Scheme

The Department of Education School Swimming and Water Safety Program is an intensive learn to swim program, which develops water confidence and provides students with basic skills in water safety and survival. Students who have not reached a satisfactory standard of water safety and survival skills and are unable to swim 25m/33m confidently unaided in deep water, are eligible to participate in the School Swimming and Water Safety Program. The program focuses on students in Years 2 to 6.

Students eligible in Years 2 to 6 have received their notes via Sentral regarding their participation in our swimming lessons which will begin next Tuesday, November 25, and continue for 10 days (excluding Mondays). Children will travel to and from the pool by bus. There will be no charge for instruction. Pool entry and transport costs will be covered by a Sporting Schools Grant.

All children must bring:

- Swimmers
- Rash shirt
- Towel
- Sunscreen

No spending money is required until the last day of lessons. Please give your child permission for the School Swimming and Water Safety Program on Sentral.

Primary Sydney Visit

Last week, Miss Allen, Mrs Adam, Mrs Smith and Mrs Horsburgh were given the opportunity to visit Grose View Public School in Sydney. This school is part of the Science of Learning Alliance with many other schools. We were each allowed to observe multiple classes throughout the day from Kindergarten to Year 6. Grose View Public School has been on a journey in the last four years based on the science and principles of explicit teaching in action. Based on this, the lessons we observed were heavily focused on reducing the cognitive load for students, allowing for maximum learning time. They also embed retrieval practices within their morning routine which sets the schema for the day. We then observed lessons on phonics, writing, fluency development, spelling mastery, maths and maths fluency. Grose View Public School had some fantastic ideas that Tottenham Central School will work on developing into our teaching from 2026.

Stage 3 Science

Stage 3 have been studying Earth and Space this term in Science. We have looked at Earth's position in the solar system, how Earth rotates around the sun and spins on its own axis and how the Moon orbits the Earth. To demonstrate the different phases of our Moon, we examined the different positions the Moon shows Earth in a lunar cycle. We explored the different terms such as full moon, new moon, waning and waxing, gibbous and crescent. To demonstrate their knowledge, Stage 3 students were asked to show the different moon phases using Oreo cookies. They had to cut the Oreo cream filling to the correct shape and label each phase. There were definitely some nibbles along the way, and once completed every single cookie was eaten. A fun way to demonstrate their learning!

Secondary Long Lunch

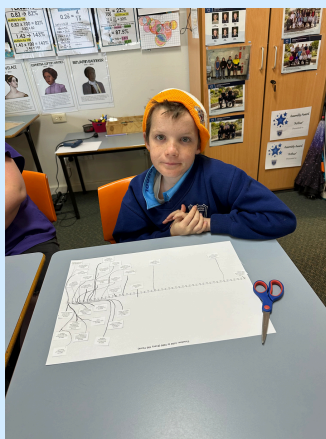
To celebrate the school year, secondary are invited to attend a Long Lunch at the Tottenham Hotel Friday 12 December.
