This is the last newsletter for Term 1. I can't believe I am writing that, when it feels like we are only about half way through. It has been a busy term and it will be a busy last week for sure. I am very excited to welcome everyone on Monday for our picnic lunch and games afternoon. I appreciate that getting to school during the day can be very tricky for some people and I am sorry for those who are unable to make it. We will eat a sandwich and play a game for you! This is a great opportunity to have an informal catch up with the teachers and our new school psychologist Ash, however it is just that, an informal catch up. The welcome afternoon is not a time for interviews, however if you would like to arrange a time to speak with the teachers or Ash in more detail this can be arranged on the day or at any other time, by contacting the school.

Next week is also the end of term assembly with our new, early starting time of 9:30am. It is hoped that this might be achievable for parents/carers as it means you can drop off your child/children and stay on for an extra hour or two. We would love to be able to share a morning tea with everyone and encourage you to bring a plate for a communal morning tea after the assembly. Again, I understand that some people will not be able to make it.

On the last Friday of school we will be having a great morning of activities for the students, to celebrate the introduction of our Learning Disposition Superheros. We would love the students to come dressed in the colours of our learning dispositions; red, green, blue, yellow, purple, indigo, orange. Students can choose to either come in one focus colour if they are developing one superpower in particular, or come wearing as many of the colours as they can, to showcase all of our learning superpowers. If the students come in school uniform, they will still be showcasing the superpower of optimism, so do not worry if you do not have any other colours. School uniform is fine. It should be a great morning of activities and friendly competition.

There has been a slight change of plans for the Stage 2 Kianinny camp. Due to a recent update around students participating in water based activities, from the School Sports Unit, we have made the decision to remove canoeing from the Kianinny excursion for Stage 2 next term. The new policy requires all students to pass a swimming confidence test to be able to participate in water based activities (even when wearing a life jacket) and the results from last year's swimming lessons indicate that some students will not meet these guidelines and we do not have the capacity to retest the students before the activity. Instead, the Kianinny staff are changing the program for us so that all students will be able to participate in all activities. This may have an impact for the Stage 3 camp to Jindabyne as well, however more information on that will follow.

Finally from me, in this newsletter you will find information about the new digital declaration that can be signed by parents/carers who are kind enough to volunteer at the school from time to time. I know that asking you to sign a form to come and volunteer might seem a bit rough but it is to ensure the safety of our students, your children. This new digital declaration will last for the duration of your time here at school unless your personal circumstances change in relation to the content of the declaration. We have included information in relation to what documents need to be signed for different types of volunteering at school and hope that this helps to explain things further. If you have any questions in relation to the new declaration after reading the attachments, please do not hesitate to contact the school. Thank you for your understanding.

Digital Declarations for volunteers

At Towamba PS we greatly value the volunteers who assist with lunch orders, excursion transport, sports carnivals and more. The Department of Education has digitised the screening process, and to volunteer you now only need to complete a screening declaration online, rather than submitting the cumberson WWC Declaration either as paper form or via the School Bytes link. We understand that some of you may have already completed the Declaration this year but we are asking you to redo your declaration form through this new process as it will be much simpler - this only needs to be done **once** for the **duration of your child's time at a NSW public school**, unless your circumstances change. An email will be sent to all parents before the end of term. It is your choice to act on it or not, but completing it means that you can continue to volunteer at our school. 
