What is happening in the Kindergarten classroom..

In our Kindergarten classroom, we've been diving into some exciting topics this term.

In English we've been exploring narrative stories and the emotions of various characters in our stories. Students are learning to identify and express feelings, fostering empathy and understanding. Through discussions and role-play, they are connecting with the characters on a deeper level. We are also using playdough to show the characters emotions.

We are also learning how stories are built. Students are discovering the beginning, middle, and end of stories, which helps them understand what they read. We are even drawing our own different parts of these stories adding detail to them for better understanding. In our writing lessons, we are talking about nouns (like names of people or things) and verbs (action words). Students are learning how to use these in their drawings to add detail.

We have looked at m,a,t,s,d and i sounds and letters and looking at rhyming words within these such as sat and mat.



In maths we have been working with numbers and patterns. We have been looking at numbers to 10 in different ways from dot patterns to tens frames. Also know smaller numbers in these bigger ones such as 2 and 3 makes 5. We are learning how to find and make patterns, which makes maths fun and interesting. Our investigations into growing and shrinking patterns have led us to discover exciting concepts of growth and shrinkage. Students are creating their own patterns using everyday objects, helping them visualise and understand these mathematical concepts in a hands-on way. Students have been engaging in fun number games that not only enhance their maths skills but also encourage teamwork and critical thinking. These



interactive activities make learning

numbers enjoyable and memorable.
