

Exploring Learning and Creativity

In our 3/4 classroom, Ms Cross and Mrs Rhodes have been thrilled with the fantastic work and enthusiasm shown by our students recently.

In Mathematics, students have been diving into multiplication and fact families. Through hands-on activities and collaborative problem-solving, they are building strong foundational skills that will support their future learning.

Our English program has been enriched by a novel study centred on Anh Do's The Little Refugee alongside the text We Are

Australians. Students have been investigating important themes within these stories, such as resilience, identity, and belonging. Inspired by these themes, they have been expressing their thoughts and feelings through creating free verse poetry, showcasing their creativity and critical thinking.

Science lessons have been equally engaging, as students research invasive pests and their impacts on our environment. This inquiry has generated thoughtful discussions about the importance of protecting our natural

world and the challenges invasive species present.


