Vote for your favourite Christmas Tree. The school with the most votes will be up for a fabulous prize. The QR Code can be found on our Facebook page.



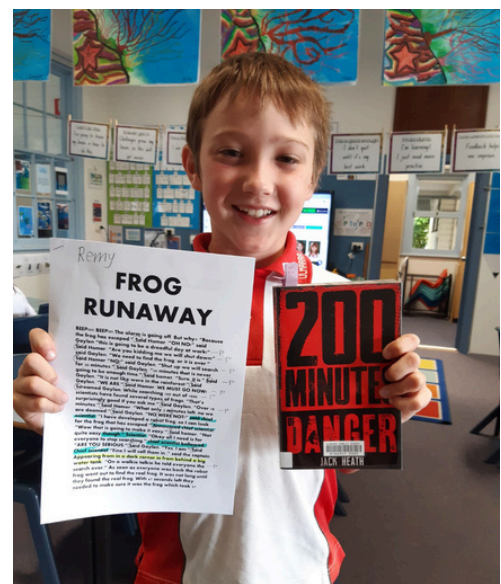
What is happening in the 3/4 classroom..

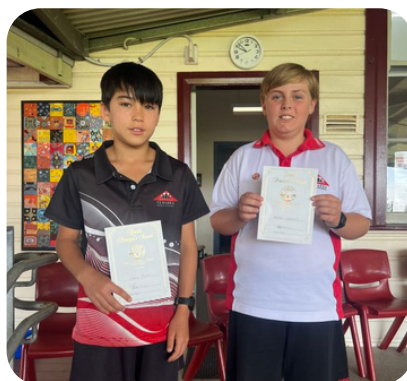
