### **Changes to Academic Reports**

From Term 2, we're introducing updated school reports for our students. These new reports have been developed by the NSW Department of Education in response to valuable feedback from parents and educators, aiming to make reports easier to read and understand.

Your child's report will continue to showcase their progress across all subject areas. Teacher comments will be provided in English, Mathematics, and the general comment section, in line with department policy. For our Kindergarten students, the general comment will also encompass all other key learning areas, including Creative Arts, HSIE, PDHPE, and science and technology.



Additionally, we are excited to include a new <u>achievement scale and</u> <u>descriptions</u>, which will give you a clearer picture of your child's progress throughout the year.

Reporting on effort is optional for schools, but as we believe it can support family conversations about learning, we have decided to include information about your child's overall effort in our reports.

### **School Holiday Road Safety Reminder for Families**

With the school holidays approaching, daily routines will soon change. Different play locations and holiday destinations means different traffic environments.

So to help keep our children safe, families are reminded about these key road safety points:

- Stop, look, listen, think every time you cross the road. If your child is aged 8 years or younger hold their hand when walking near or across roads. If your child is 9-10 years old always actively supervise them.
- It's the law that everyone wears a helmet when riding a bike in a public place. It makes sense to wear a helmet when riding scooters and skateboards too!
- Click clack front 'n back every person for every trip. Everyone in the car must be securely buckled up in the right seatbelt or child restraint.
- Talk to your child about being a safe road user. Reinforce safe road behaviours by being a good role model! Children learn safe road behaviours from the adults who care for them. Talk about what you are doing to be safe when near roads, in the car and when riding.
- Point out road safety differences and dangers in new environments. This is especially important when on holidays in different surroundings. Roads, footpaths, parks, carparks, bike tracks and bike lanes may look different in holiday areas.

The best way to keep your child safe is to actively supervise them.

Talk and teach your child about road safety every time you are out an about.

Remind other adults who care for your children to do this too.

This term we celebrated World Storytelling Day in the library with a special reading of Neville's Great Escape. Students have enjoyed the new junior non-fiction collection donated by the P&C and books are flying off the shelves. ### **Breakfast Reading Club-Term 2**

### What is Breakfast Reading Club?

Last year, Kindergarten, Year 1 and selected Year 2 students were selected to participate in the Breakfast Reading Club program on Thursday mornings, in the library, before school. We know that reading to children in their early stages of life, has a significant positive effect on their reading skills and cognitive skills (language and literacy, numeracy, and cognition) later in life. This program has been designed to allow the opportunity for our students to have access to quality literature and to be read to by adults. This program is run by Ms Barbagallo and a team of teachers who volunteer their morning before school to read to students. Students are also offered a complimentary light breakfast whilst they are attending the program. We are also fortunate to have volunteers from Screen Australia who share the love of reading with our students. The purpose of this club is for students to familiarise themselves with the English language, practice pronunciation and develop comprehension skills, as well as promote a love of literacy within our students. Students explore and discuss texts and themes, look at visual literacy, explore quality literature from Australian authors and engage in conversation about texts.



This program is a tailored program offered to Kindergarten and Year 1 students and selected Year 2 students. Students are selected by their class teacher to attend the program and permissions will be sent out early next term via school bytes. We anticipate the program to commence in Week 6, Term 2. Volunteers for Breakfast Reading Club

Last year we invited Years 4, 5 & 6 students who are competent and confident readers to volunteer to read to our younger students. This provides students with a mentor relationship with their younger peers and it is a good opportunity to strengthen their confidence in discussions around text. Please encourage your child to volunteer their time and skills for this program.

Please see Ms Barbagallo in the Library to pick up a volunteer form in Term 2, Week 1. Students will not be able to attend, unless parent permission has been given.

### **Payments and Permissions:**

Permission notes will be sent out via School Bytes, and it's important to sign and submit them by the due date. To ensure your child can participate in PSSA sports, all necessary payments must be made by the due date. If this is not received your child may lose their position to another student.

#### Code of Conduct:

Once teams are selected, both students and families will receive a Code of Conduct to review and sign together. We ask that you take the time to discuss it with your child, as it helps ensure a positive experience for everyone involved. Following the school's behaviour code throughout the week is crucial for participation in Friday PSSA games. If the code is not adhered to, students may face temporary suspension from games or removal from the team. Thank you for your support in fostering a respectful and enjoyable environment!

Stage 1 have been learning about bees and their environments in their integrated Science and Writing unit in Term 1. Students consolidated their understanding in Week 8 during a Super Pollinators Incursion. During the incursion students learnt about the diversity of native bees, the importance of pollination and the important role of bees and pollination in sustainability. Students also created a habitat for local solitary bee species, they constructed a timber bee hotel using a hammer to nail pieces of timber together and they inserted bamboo for the nests. Solitary bees are super pollinators and they do not produce honey therefore they are not aggressive as they have no hive to defend, we learnt that solitary native bees rarely sting.
