### PRINCIPAL REPORT

#### **Road Safety Around Ultimo Public School**

I want to take a moment to remind everyone about the importance of safety when driving around our school. Recently, I have noticed an increase in the number of vehicles performing three-point turns on Jones Street during peak times. Additionally, there have been instances where cars are not stopping for the crossing supervisor, which poses a significant risk.

Ensuring the safety of our children and the broader school community is a shared responsibility. I encourage all drivers to abide by the road rules and exercise caution to minimise the risk of accidents.

Please take the time to follow designated traffic regulations, stop for crossing supervisors, and be mindful of our students as they arrive and leave school.

Thank you for your cooperation and commitment to keeping our school environment safe for everyone.





# Parking safely in school zones



### No parking signs

- You can only stop in a No Parking zone while picking up or setting down passengers or goods. You have a maximum of 2 minutes from the time you stop and must stay within 3m of your vehicle at all times.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times. This is not a waiting zone.





### Driveways and footpaths

- When exiting or entering a driveway you must give way to people walking on the footpath.
- Driveways are not playgrounds. Be aware that children can go unnoticed in front and behind your vehicle. Don't solely rely on reverse sensors or cameras in your vehicle.
- Always supervise and hold a child's hand near or crossing driveways.
- It's illegal to park in or across any driveway or to block a footpath at any time.



### Double parking

 Don't double park at any time.
 Double parking is illegal and dangerous, especially around schools. It reduces visibility and blocks the road for other motorists.



### U turns

- Performing U turns or 3 point turns in school zones is extremely dangerous.
- Performing U turns across unbroken centre lines is illegal and is particularly dangerous around schools.

### No stopping zones

- No Stopping signs mean you must not stop here at any time. If times are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only during those hours.
- An unbroken yellow kerb line is a no stopping line. You must not stop for any reason.







### Bus zone signs

- A Bus Zone is a No Stopping zone for vehicles other than buses. If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction applies only at those times.
- You must not park your vehicle less than 20m before or 10m after a bus stop.







### Using mobile phones

 It's illegal to make or receive a call on your mobile phone while you're driving unless your phone is secured in a fixed mounting or doesn't require you to touch it in any way.



- It's illegal to use the other features of a mobile phone such as texting or emailing unless your car is legally parked and the ignition is switched off.
- Using mobile phones is a major distraction and higher fines and demerit points apply in school zones.

A feature of our literacy support is the MultiLit program, delivered by Kathryn Arkapaw. This evidence-based intervention program is specifically designed to support struggling readers and enhance their literacy skills. Through structured lessons that focus on phonemic awareness, decoding, and comprehension, students receive the essential tools they need to become confident, independent readers.

Our committed Student Learning Support Officers – Batoul, Zara, Eden, Najat, Vivien and Ella play an invaluable role in supporting our students in every aspect of school life. They provide essential assistance not only academically but also socially, helping students navigate challenges in the playground and classroom alike. Their dedication extends beyond the school day, as they attend overnight camps and other extracurricular activities, ensuring that every student feels supported and included.


### From The Library






