ACTION REQUIRED:

Inner West & Inner City Intake Area Review

Please be advised that the Department of Education will be reviewing our school's enrolment intake area this term.

The department regularly reviews intake areas and adjusts them where necessary to ensure every child is guaranteed a place at their local public school.

As part of the review, the department will be engaging with the P&C Executive, our Director, Educational Leadership and I, about how the current intake area can better meet the needs of our school community.

To support these conversations, the department is now inviting the broader school community to provide feedback about the current intake area directly to the department via this [survey](#). Your insights will help ensure that any decisions about future adjustments consider local sensitivities, community cohesion and how the department can deliver the best possible outcome for the greatest number of families.

The deadline to provide feedback is Friday 4 July 2025.

Feedback will be reviewed by the department and used to inform ongoing engagement with the P&C and school leadership.

It is important to note that the department reviews intake areas in the context of several important criteria, including:

- Walkability and accessibility for students
- Local geography and major road safety concerns
- Public transport availability and road congestion
- Alignment between primary and secondary intake areas to support smoother student transitions to high school.

Please also note that this review does not guarantee our intake area will be adjusted. Adjustments will only be made if required, and any adjustments will only apply to new student enrolments. Existing students will not be affected.

Should adjustments take place, families with a child currently enrolled at our school, as an in-area enrolment, will retain the entitlement to enrol siblings at the same school, even if their home address is considered out-of-area as a result of the changes.

Ancestral Lines by Jeremy Morgan Worrall

This artwork is a visual representation of the generational lines that carry through my mob. When I think of the next generation, I think towards my ancestors—Lucy Wright, Enoch Wright, Nonie Wright—through to my Nanna Audrie and my Mother Vanessa. Looking back gives me the strength and vision to look forward. Each figure in the painting is tied to family lines, like songlines, reflecting what they knew and what they passed on. The first represents lore, hunting, and tracking. The second reflects care, weaving, and love. The third shows the two combined, while the final two carry unfinished elements—symbols of knowledge and care in motion. Above them sits the essence of Country—swirling skies and a giant moon over Emmaville. It is by the fire, under these cool skies, where the next generation finds their strength, vision, and legacy.

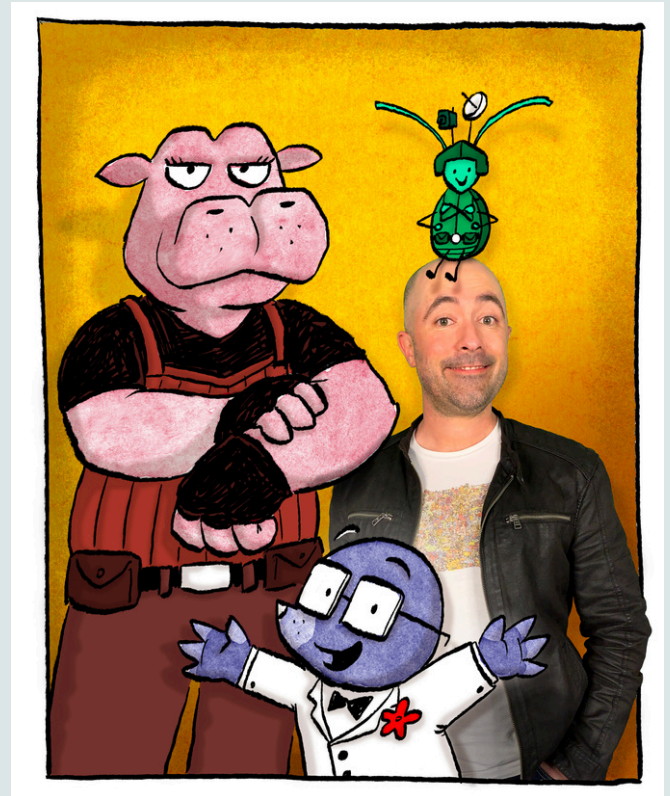
James Foley

If your child wishes to purchase a copy of James Foley's books, students can order via the flyer included below and James will personally sign all copies on the day.

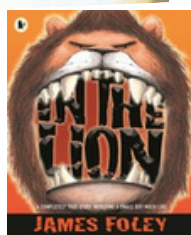
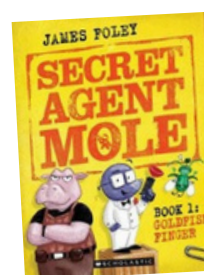

Every Thursday morning in the Library, there's a buzz of excitement as students gather for our Breakfast Reading Club! It has been pleasing to see our older students reading with our younger ones — sharing stories, exploring characters, and engaging in conversations about books.

Students have been exploring characters within a text and having quality discussions about how characters evolve and change throughout a story.

The energy is positive and calm, and it's clear the students are thoroughly enjoying themselves. It's a wonderful way to start the day — with connection, curiosity, and a great book in hand!

NSW Premier's Reading Challenge reaches the halfway mark!

The NSW Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) has hit the halfway mark for 2025, and all students in Kindergarten to Year 6 are encouraged to participate in this enriching initiative.

The NSW PRC provides students with the opportunity to engage with literature and discover the joy of reading. All students who successfully complete the PRC receive a certificate signed by the Premier of NSW. Students who have completed the challenge for 4 years (does not need to be consecutive) will receive a Gold award and students who have completed the challenge for 7 years (does not need to be consecutive), will receive a Platinum award!

Students have been given an additional 4 weeks to complete the reading challenge this year, with the new student deadline set for **Friday 19 September 2025 (Term 3, Week 9)**. Although the challenge has hit the halfway mark, it's never too late to start reading and recording. With over 15,000 books on the PRC book lists, there's bound to be a book on the list for every reader and students can add up to 10 books of their choice. Books read since the conclusion of the 2024 challenge in August last year can be included on students' reading logs for this year.

These school holidays provide a great opportunity for students to complete the challenge.

Last Thursday, students joined a free virtual incursion moderated by the State Library of NSW. The session was packed with fascinating facts, real historical documents and stories from the past!

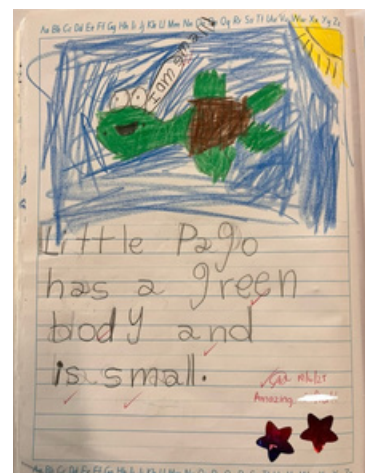
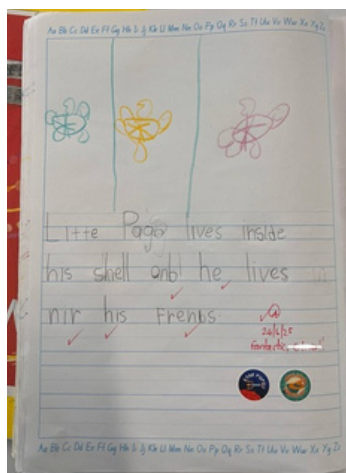
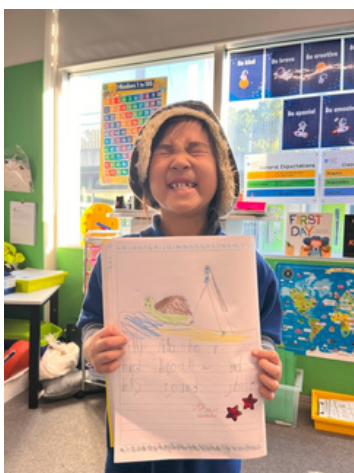

This fortnight we have been focusing on growing **leadership**.

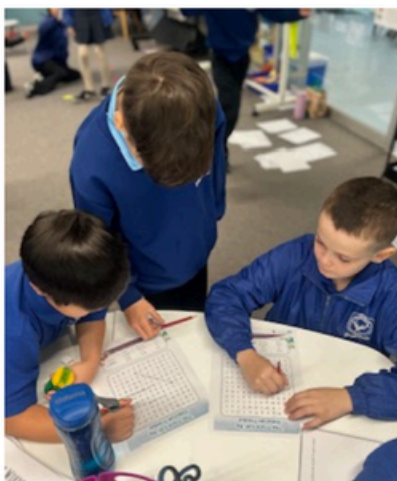
Leadership means you can encourage a group to get things done in a way that is peaceful and everyone feels included.

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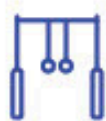
