Important Reminder About Safe Pick-Up and Drop-Off Procedures

As we strive to maintain a safe environment for all our students, I would like to remind everyone about the importance of following safe pick-up and drop-off procedures at our school. I have received concerns from community members about how our families are picking up and dropping off their children. Ensuring the safety of our students during these busy times is a shared responsibility, and your cooperation is crucial.

Here are some important safety tips for drivers using the drop-off and pick-up zones:

- **Use Designated Zones:** Always drop off or pick up your child from the designated drop-off and pick-up zones to ensure the safety of all students and to avoid blocking access for emergency vehicles. Do not allow your child to enter or leave your car if you have not pulled over to the curb.
- **Stay Alert:** Be aware of your surroundings, watching out for pedestrians and other vehicles, especially during peak times.
- **Follow Guidelines:** Adhere to the school's guidelines and any traffic signs or signals in place to help manage road safety effectively.
- **Do Not Obstruct Traffic:** Ensure that you are not parked in a way that obstructs the flow of traffic or creates a hazard for others.
- **Encourage Safe Routes:** Talk to your child about using the safest route possible when entering or exiting the school.

Road safety



Driving and parking safely near schools

The beginning and end of the school day are busy times around schools. That is why you need to take extra care in 40km/h school zones.

Drive safely

- Slow down to 40km/h in the school zone and stay aware of crossings.
- At a supervised crossing, follow the directions of the School Crossing Supervisor. They help manage traffic and assist children to use the crossings on roads near and outside of schools.
- Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.

Park legally and safely

- Parking signs are planned with children's safety in mind.
- Park safely and legally, even if it means walking further to the school gate.
- Always park and turn legally around the school. U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous.
- Never double park as it puts children at risk.
- · Never park in a bus zone or in the school bus bay.

- Don't park across the school driveway or the entrance to the school car park.
- Make sure your child uses the 'Safety Door' (rear kerb side door) to get in and out of the vehicle.
- Model safe and considerate behaviour for your child – they learn from you.
- It's always a good idea to use the drop off and pick up area suggested by your school. This will help keep all children as safe as possible during the busiest times of the school day.

Children learn safe road user habits from you and will continue them when they are old enough to travel alone.

DESIGNED TO CHALLENGE

DOWN BY THE WATER - KAYAKING CHALLENGE (MAX 16 STUDENTS)

With the SSC Balmain's close proximity to the Parramatta River and Balmain Cove (The Bay) we aim to provide opportunities for students to engage in a range of activities in class and during school sport and make the most of this fantastic natural resource. One popular activity we run at SSC Balmain is kayaking. Students will get to learn the basic paddle strokes for kayaking, water safety and the benefits of outdoor physical activity. Spaces are limited to a maximum of 16 students on the water. Students should have a strong swimming ability.

HSIE TASTER (MAX 16 STUDENTS)

In Human Society and its Environment students explore the world around them. As part of the Peninsula Engagement Program they will be engaged in an enquiry regarding the unique environmental features of Balmain, and a hands-on historic mummification process.

TECHNOLOGY TASTER (MAX 20 STUDENTS)

Students will get a taster of studying Technology in high school by undertaking small projects using the equipment and tools available such as engineering, timber, textiles and food technology.

PROGRAMS THIS YEAR

AMAZING SCIENCE - SCIENCE IS FUN (MAX 24 STUDENTS)

Amazing Science - Science is Fun will involve research in an area of Science the students are interested in and fun interactive science demonstrations, challenges and activities. Students will be placed in groups and present their research to their peers at the end of the second day. Each group will be supplied with a laptop loan device and will join a Google Classroom where they will be able to create their presentations.

GIRLS STEM (MAX 16 STUDENTS)

The SSC PEP Girls STEM Club will involve taking part in a variety of self-directed projects in STEM areas. PEP students will work together with Balmain Campus Girls STEM Club participants in undertaking activities which may include 3D printing, robotics, Engineering STEM challenges, Rockets, Makey Makeys and Adafruit Playground Express activities.

PIXEL TO PLASTIC (MAX 12 STUDENTS)

Focusing on introductions to 3D design and giving students hands-on experience in being able to 3D print using filament printers.
