Well done, 3/4W - you should be very proud of yourselves!



































#### **AFL**

Thank you for being part of our school community and for helping us make Education Week a memorable celebration. We look forward to welcoming you again soon!





























































































































#### NATIONAL WEEK OF ACTION AGAINST BULLYING


Standing Together Against Bullying: National Week of Action


We are committed to fostering a safe and welcoming environment where every student feels valued and heard. Thank you to all our families for your ongoing support in helping us create a positive school community.

#### UPCOMING ATHLETICS CARNIVAL - THURSDAY, 21ST AUGUST

We are excited to announce our annual Athletics Carnival, which will take place on Thursday, 21st August, at the Mingara Regional Sports Centre. This year, all students from Kindergarten to Year 6 are invited to participate in what promises to be a fun-filled day of competition and camaraderie. #### Schedule for the Day:

- All students will attend school in the morning for registration and attendance marking before boarding buses to Mingara.
- The first events, the Age Sprints, will kick off around 9:30am, followed by a rotation of track and field events for all age groups (8, 9, 10, 11, 12 years).
- Our K-2 students will have a special focus, participating in a series of fun sport and novelty events located in the centre of the field.
