




Primary Science Taster Day Sparks Curiosity and Fun at WCS

On Tuesday 19 August, Year 6 students from Wadalba CS and Porters Creek PS were treated to an exciting and educational experience during the Primary Science Taster Day held at the WCS Science Labs. This special event was designed to ignite curiosity and encourage young learners to dive deeper into the fascinating world of Science and STEM.

The morning was packed with engaging, hands-on experiments and lively interactive discussions that brought scientific concepts to life in a fun and accessible way. Highlights included a salt water density column rainbow, where students observed how layers of differently concentrated salt water create vibrant, colourful bands, illustrating principles of density and buoyancy.

Adding to the excitement was the magnetic Hot Wheels car race, an interactive challenge that demonstrated the power of magnetism in motion. Students cheered as their magnet-powered cars raced along the track, sparking conversations about magnetic forces, friction and energy.




Our annual Father's Day Stall is being held on Wednesday 3rd September.
