

NSW School Vaccination Program 2025 - Catch Up Vaccinations Tuesday 28th October 2025.

The following catch up vaccines are offered free of charge to Year 7 students at school on Tuesday 28th October 2025

Year 7 students

- diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine (1
 - human papillomavirus (HPV) (1 dose).

Year 10 students

• meningococcal ACWY vaccine (1 dose).

Vaccination will only be provided at school if consent has been received.

To provide consent for vaccination online, parents/carers will need:

- To complete online consent parents/carers need to visit the School Vaccination Program online consent portal (https://engage.health.nsw.gov.au/engage).
- · For detailed steps on how to provide consent please refer to the NSW Health webpage, How to Provide Consent (https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/online -consent-school-vaccination.aspx)

For online consent parents/carers will need:

- their ServiceNSW log-in details, or to create an account with ServiceNSW if they don't already have one
 - Medicare details for parents/carers and their child.

Benefits of online consent for parents/carers:

- SMS notification three days before the clinic to remind parents of the vaccination day • SMS notifications on the day once vaccinations are given
 - · easy updating of their child's details online
- faster upload of their child's vaccination records to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR)



14s Boys Cricket Knockout

Wauchope High took on Macksville High at Fairmont Gardens last Thursday (16 Oct) in the 14s Boys Cricket Statewide Knockout. Macksville won the toss and elected to bowl in steamy conditions. Liam and Lloyed were quite solid early until an excellent yorker dismissed Lloyed, bringing Kale to the crease. Almost from the first ball he faced, Kale demonstrated excellent timing and placement, reaching 42 at the first drinks break, whilst given excellent support from Liam, who made 15 before being dismissed. Kale continued to score runs despite losing Jaxzyn and Peytyn quickly. Curtis came in and did a great job in hanging around, as well as turning the strike over when he could. By the second drinks break, Kale had reached 90 and had a full 10 overs to get the remaining 10 runs for his century. Sadly for Kale, he only managed 2 more runs before being caught for a fantastic 92, including nine 4s and two 6s. Diamond pythons are closely related to the commonly recognised carpet python. They are black in colour with cream or yellow, diamond-shaped blotches covering the entire length of their body. They are the most cold adapted python in the world.

Being a python, they are non-venomous. They constrict their prey in order to kill it and then consume it whole.

These pythons live in the coastal areas of New South Wales and are an arboreal species. They are expert tree climbers and perfectly camouflage in forest and woodland areas. Just like other pythons, they are carnivorous. Possums, rodents, bird and bats are their most common meal of choice.

Diamond pythons are commonly found living in suburban environments and are great for keeping unwanted rodents under control.



Student access to NSWEduChat

Information for parents and carers

NSWEduChat is a generative artificial intelligence tool owned and designed by the NSW Department of Education. It is designed to be safe, educational, secure and private.

Student access to NSWEduChat

Students in Year 5 to Year 12 will gain access to NSWEduChat in Term 4, 2025.

Safety of students using NSWEduChat

NSWEduChat data is secured. All data stays within the department. This means that students can input their work and personal identifying information safely into NSWEduChat.

Educational design of NSWEduChat

NSWEduChat does not simply provide the full answers to questions. It responds to students by asking open-ended questions. This encourages students to explore and share their thoughts and reasoning.

NSWEduChat only uses text. This means it cannot produce media such as pictures, video or music.

Using NSWEduChat for help with homework and assessment tasks

If schools advise that NSWEduChat can be used for homework or assessments, students should notify their teachers if they have used NSWEduChat in completing tasks. This includes using NSWEduChat for tasks such as, but not limited to, summarising study notes, definition of key terms or structuring text. Schools should communicate the ways in which students can reasonably notify their teachers.

Access to NSWEduChat at home

Students can access NSWEduChat at home through:

- the student portal at https://portal.education.nsw.gov.au/
- directly via <u>chat.education.nsw.gov.au</u>

Students will need to log in using their NSW Department of Education login. Only the student who logged in should use NSWEduChat.




