

Students explored the different types of rocks and discovered their traditional uses by the First Peoples of Australia. They learned how rocks have long served as tools, resources, and a medium for storytelling through art — such as petroglyphs (rock carvings).



The highlight of the day was the opportunity for each student to create their own replica petroglyph, combining creativity with cultural learning.








BROSPEAK



SISTASPEAK














We're excited to kick off another year of SistaSpeak at Wauchope High School!


Do you like drawing manga or anime characters or pictures?


