


LUNA PARK REWARD DAY 2024









Throughout 2024, teachers at Wauchope High School, recognised the consistent efforts of our students throughout the year and recorded a Merit on our computer system. As students accumulated these Merits, they may have achieved Bronze, Silver, Gold or Platinum Level. In Term 4, we looked at the highest achieving students and checked for negative incidents before inviting them to attend a Reward Excursion to Luna Park, Sydney, at a highly reduced cost to each student. Not every student invited attended the excursion, so staff moved down the list, from Platinum down to Gold and Silver, until we had enough students who qualified to fill the required number of positions available for the excursion.

On **Friday 13th December**, **2024**, 5 staff members from WHS took 41 students to Luna Park, on the edge of Sydney harbour and in the shadow of the Sydney Harbour Bridge. It was a very early start, leaving WHS at 4:30 a.m.. We arrived at the venue at 10 a.m. with the students very excited to explore the rides and stalls that the venue had to offer. Some students were a little more adventurous than others as some of the pictures show. With other schools also attending the venue, students had to endure lengthy waits in lines for some of the experiences. Most of these schools had to depart before 2:30 p.m. which meant that WHS students had almost no crowd to contend with and could go on ride after ride without even having to wait in a line.

By the time we had to depart the venue at 5 p.m., most were exhausted, including the staff. With a dinner stop on our way back, we arrived back to WHS before 10:30 p.m.. Most had a sleep before being woken by the sudden stop of the coach outside the front of the school. Parents eagerly waiting for their child's description of their experience. All students and staff thoroughly enjoyed the long day.



So what does 2025 bring?

We again, are looking at a reward excursion in December. Details are unknown at this point but Raging Waters, Sydney (formerly Wet n Wild) is a possibility.

If students wish to be a part of this experience then they must follow the School's Core Values (Best Effort, Care and Respect and Safety) so that they receive a Merit for their consistent behaviour and achieve the highest level of the School's Merit System (Platinum, Gold, Silver and Bronze).

YEAR 7 VACCINATIONS

The following vaccines are offered free of charge to students at school:

Year 7 students (Thursday 20th February)

- diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine (1 dose)
 - human papillomavirus (HPV) (1 dose).

Year 10 students (Date to be advised in Term 2)

• meningococcal ACWY vaccine (1 dose).

Vaccination will only be provided at school if consent has been received.

To provide consent for vaccination online, parents/carers will need:

- To complete online consent parents/carers need to visit the School Vaccination Program online consent portal or scan the QR code available.
- For detailed steps on how to provide consent please refer to the NSW Health webpage or scan the QR code available.

For online consent parents/carers will need:

- their ServiceNSW log-in details, or to create an account with ServiceNSW if they don't already have one
 - Medicare details for parents/carers and their child.

Benefits of online consent for parents/carers:

- SMS notification three days before the clinic to remind parents of the vaccination day • SMS notifications on the day once vaccinations are given
 - · easy updating of their child's details online
 - faster upload of their child's vaccination records to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR)
- Printed consent forms are available and can be given to students where parents/carers cannot provide online consent, including for parents/carers or students who do not have a Medicare card or internet access. Please call Melissa Broderick on 65851400

GETTING TO SCHOOL BY BUS IN 2025

Bus passes

- All students catching the bus in 2025 will need a school travel pass.
- Under the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS), eligible students can apply for free or subsided travel between home and school.
- For more information about the School Student Transport Scheme and how to apply for a school travel pass, visit https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/ from a desktop computer.

Bus timetables

Busways is the school bus operator that runs your schools' bus services. To find your child's school bus timetable visit the Busways website by using the following steps:

- 1.Go to <u>busways.com.au/nsw</u>
- 2. Click on 'school services' in the navigation bar and then proceed to 'school timetables'
- 3. Enter the school's name in the field that says 'enter a school name'
- 4. Select the school's name and the timetable should open on your device. If you are unable to find or search for the school's name, use the drop-down menus on the same web page to find the school.
- 5.Once the timetable is opened, you will be able to identify which school bus services are available in your area for your child to use.
