




NSW PUBLIC SCHOOL'S SURVEY

A reminder that next week, we are offering our students the opportunity to participate in the NSW Public Schools Student Survey. This replaces the Tell Them From Me survey we have conducted in previous years and will be open to students in 2025, with parents and teachers invited to complete the survey from 2026. The survey gives students the chance to share their thoughts and feelings about life at school, including questions about their engagement, learning experiences and wellbeing at school.

Hearing directly from our students will help us understand what's working well and where improvements can be made to our school. The survey is confidential, takes around 10 to 15 minutes to complete, and will be conducted online during school hours.

Participation is voluntary. If you prefer your child not to participate, please complete the optout consent form, which was emailed to parents/carers earlier this term, and a reminder sent 20th June, and return it to the school. RUGBY LEAGUE GALA DAY



On Wednesday 18th of June, the 14s Girls team took part in the Country Cup Gala Day at the Wood Street fields in Port Macquarie. A number of recent injuries and a couple of late withdrawals left the girls with only 12 players to start the day,

The girls played three games in total, against Mackillop, Regional and Great Lakes Forster. In the Mackillop match, we actually took the field with 10, with two of the girls still getting ready at kickoff. When Ruby came on, she ran 50 metres with her first touch to score under the posts, and Aaliyah converted. Fatigue sent in and Mackillop finally overcame us by two tries, 22-12. There was a blow in the last tackle of the game, with Peyton sustaining an injury that prevented her from playing for the rest of the day.

Taking the field with 11 against Regional, the girls played amazing football to take a 10-nil lead and completely shock their opponents. Although Regional came back and finally took the win by one try, the Wauchope girls never gave up and played tough.

The final game against Great Lakes College was a triumph for the Wauchope girls, showing both greater rugby league experience as well as pure toughness and will to win. The scoreline of 20-4 was amazing, considering the girls were playing 13 against 11 for the entire game.

A 3, 2 and 1 was announced at the end of the games played, with Ruby taking the 3 points by scoring 7 tries in the day, Shakiylah and Clancie 2 points each for their powerful ball-running and solid defence, and Lailani 1 point for her excellent service at dummy-half. The girls were great to coach, and they all contributed strongly in some way in each of the games.

RUGBY LEAGUE GALA DAY

Wauchope High School's 15s boys attended the Country Cup Gala Day at Stuart Park, Port Macquarie last Wednesday 11th of June. A few late withdrawals left the team with only 14 players, making things fairly tough from the outset.

Unfortunately, the sheer size of the Kempsey team began to take its toll, and whilst our boys tried valiantly, they gave up four tries which allowed the win to go to the Kempsey team.

Again, the boys were brave, but they eventually ran out of puff as the defensive workload became too great. The game had to be called off just before the scheduled end, due to a major injury to Lachlan, which sadly put a damper on the whole day.

The best defensive players across the two games were Matt, Levi and Kai, whilst Billy and Peytyn were the strongest attackers.





SISTASPEAK
