

Winners were Conner, Candice, Rodney and Indy. Congratulations to these students and all who participated.






BOCCIA TEAM



During Week 2, Henry P, Alex W, Riley L, Zoey H, Brock S, and Flynn S from our talented Supported Learning travelled to Sydney to compete in the School Sport Unit Boccia State Finals. It was an exciting day filled with teamwork, determination, and plenty of smiles. Our students competed against schools from all over New South Wales, showing great skill and sportsmanship. Out of 26 teams, our group proudly placed 21st – an achievement they can all be proud of! Even more impressive was the way our students conducted themselves throughout the day. They displayed excellent behaviour, encouraged each other, and represented our school with pride. A big thank you to the staff and families who supported the trip – and congratulations to our boccia champions for making the day such a success.







Boccia can be played by individuals, pairs, or teams of three. The aim of the game is to throw leather balls — coloured red or blue (which side uses which is determined by a coin toss) as close as they can to a white target ball, or jack. The jack is thrown first, then the first two regular balls are played (first, the player who threw the jack then the opposing side), after which the side furthest away from the jack goes next in an attempt to either get closer to the jack or knock the opposition's ball out of the way. In this fashion, each round, or end, will continue until one side has played all their balls, at which point, the opposing side will play their remaining balls. The balls can be moved with hands, feet, or, if the competitor's disability is severe, with an assistive device such as a ramp. At the end of each end, the referee measures the distance of the balls closest to the jack, and awards points accordingly — one point for each ball that is closer to the jack than the opponent's closest ball. The team/player with the highest number of points at the end of play is the winner. If both teams have the same number of points after all ends have been played, one additional end is played to determine a winner.

LNC 15S BASKETBALL GALA DAY







A boys and girls team from Wauchope High competed in the 15s CHS Knockout gala day at Port Macquarie Indoor Stadium on the 7th of August. There were other schools from Camden Haven to Nambucca Heads in attendance for a great, fun-filled day.

The boys played Bowraville in the first game of the day and produced an excellent team effort to run out convincing 47-24 winners. The scoring was shared between most of the boys, but Shane, Peytyn, David and Matt were the standouts in this match.

The girls first encounter was with Camden Haven and the game was very close during the first two quarters. However, the strong defence of the Wauchope girls proved the difference in the second half, as they frustrated their opponents to eventually emerge 43-17 victors. Leoni, Jasmine, Tiannah and Jlarni were the main attacking weapons, while Candice, Brydee, Elle-Lea, Laylah and Savhanna were impressive in defence. In their second game, the boys unfortunately drew the talented Port High team, and they struggled to match the physical size and skill level of their Port counterparts. Finally, the girls contested the Final against Westport and it was a similar story to the first game. The two teams were very close in the early exchanges, until superior defensive pressure snuffed out the Westport attack and allowed Wauchope to run out 35-18 winners. The girls played a great team game all day and were deserved winners of the knockout day. Congratulations on a terrific performance.

The girls will now travel to Coffs Harbour to play for a chance to reach the North Coast final. We wish them all the best in their efforts.


