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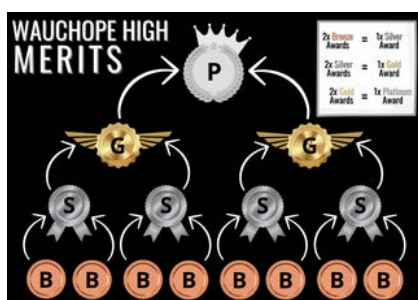

Congratulations to all players on a great effort and for showcasing the spirit of our school at such a high level of competition

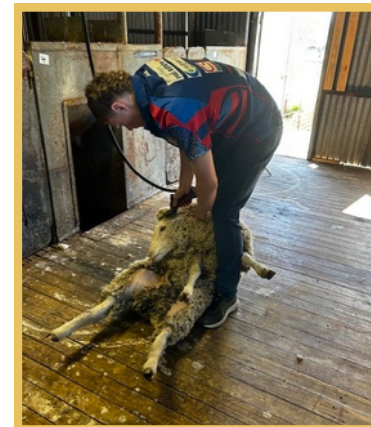
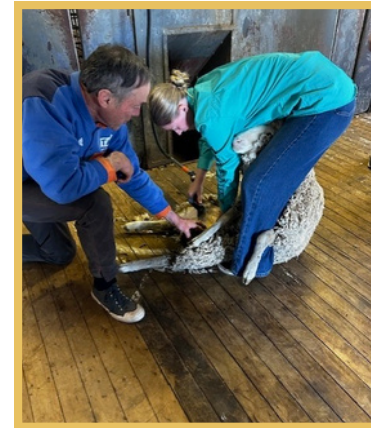

It was an early start on Monday morning. Clear cold and frosty at 5am should have seen us on our way, unfortunately we had a delay due to an apparent alarm malfunction. But hey Pippa and Skye finally made an appearance so we headed for Walcha for a quick pit stop via the twist and turns of Gingers Creek. There were no regurgitations on the way so it proves that travel calm dose work, isn't that right Karina? The day wasn't getting any better by the time we reached Walcha as we found out that the bakery had closed, so it was servo snacks or IGA. We reached the woolshed at Trelawney by 10am to be greeted by our shearing hosts of 2025 Leo and Ross.

With a quick change of attire the students were straight into it, toolbox talk, meet and greet and as Ross always says don't be a d*** head. The students were quickly introduced to the fine art of how to crutch a sheep. That is after you have wrestled it down first, dragged it out of the pen, learnt how to hold it while removing wool from its face, butt and pizzle. All of this was to be undertaken whilst holding a very sharp shearing handpiece and trying not to cut the sheep or themselves.

The students toiled away for 2 days, putting in some long hours which brought on fatigue as well as satisfaction knowing they had all learnt some new skills in team work, resilience and how to remove burrs from their fingers.

By morning the rivers were flowing back to a minor flood level so we ventured into the Tamworth TAFE to complete our theory work and spent the afternoon at the Jemalong wool store where some people were being childish and playing footsy tag your in (including the TAFE teacher)

We dined at the golden arches in Gunnedah before returning to Lake Keepit to pack and get ready for departure in the morning. There was still another day of shearing awaiting the students, though it was going to be the muddy track in that would test us. I was not keen at first although with some rallied student support and cheering saying you've got this sir just send it. We headed into the woolshed fully loaded and after a few deep causeways and red clay patches we made it in to complete our day of shearing.

We completed our last day of shearing with some smiles and relief that they had finally completed the task. A big thank you to staff that covered both Karina and my classes whilst we were away as these excursions are not possible without support. Thankyou to Karina for coming along to crack the whip, again another champion effort and to the participating students for their involvement and effort throughout the week, thank you all for being part of this shearing school.

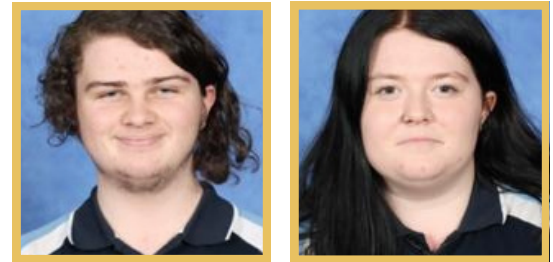

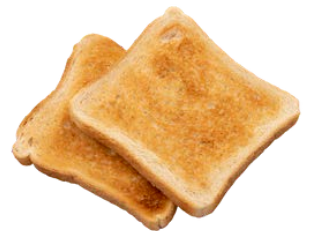

SCHOOL INFORMATION

At Wauchope High School all mobile phones are required to be turned off and placed in a locked pouch (Yondr) for the full school day, including recess and lunch. This will mean that students will have a responsibility to turn off their phone, place it in the locked pouch and store it safely in their school bag for the course of the school day.

This is an approved NSW Department of Education option and will limit unnecessary distractions and complement our ongoing approach to ensure every student maximises their learning and social growth in a safe and supportive environment.

Coast to Country Charity Walk: A Journey of Grit, Giving, and Education



We're proud to spotlight the upcoming Coast to Country Charity Walk, kicking off on October 14th from the PCYC in Port Macquarie and concluding in Tamworth on October 24th. Local mum Jeri Wanbeck—is lacing up her walking shoes for an extraordinary journey with a powerful purpose.

From 14-24 October 2025, Jeri will take on the Coast to Country Walk, a 10-day trek from Port Macquarie PCYC to Tamworth, aiming to raise \$300,000. The funds will be split equally between the Country Education Foundation (CEF) and the Hastings Education Fund, both dedicated to supporting rural and regional young people to further their education, training, and employment opportunities. The walk also honours the legacy of Mr Christopher Mark Murphy OAM, former manager of INXS, whose deep connection to the land and unwavering support for youth continues to inspire.

Jeri won't be walking alone. She'll be joined on the road by her brothers and sons. Behind the scenes, the all-important support crew will be led by her husband and the other children supporting - Jeri and Marlon have 7 kids!

The route will see the group cover 300 kilometres, passing through key communities including Wauchope, Beechwood, Bellangry, Yarowitch, Walcha, Woolbrook, Limbri, and Koolberrah before arriving in Tamworth. Each town along the way offers a chance to connect with locals, raise awareness, and inspire donations.

The walk will begin just after sunrise—around 7:30 am—on the 14th of October at the Port Macquarie PCYC, with community members encouraged to come along, cheer the team on for the start. Please note people aren't able to walk with the C2C team due to road safety; however, you can cheer them on at various points along the walking route from Port Macquarie to Beechwood on Day 1 which will publish a map in an upcoming newsletter.

The Coast to Country Walk isn't just a fundraiser—it's a journey of connection, determination, and hope for a brighter future for our youth.

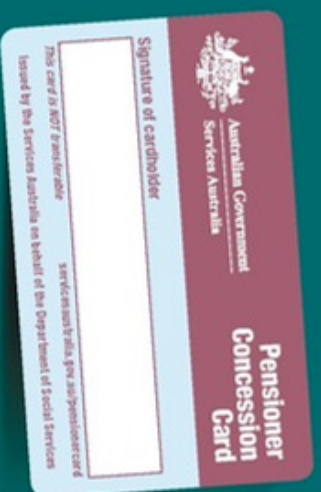
