Building Bridges

It's about connection, understanding, and the choices we make every day in how we treat each other.

Imagine two best friends. Let's call them Sally and Alison. This applies to boys as well. Their names could be Jake and Tom. For years, they were inseparable here at school – shared lunches, played together every break time, helped each other with homework. They were a team, always looking out for one another. Their friendship felt strong and unbreakable.

But one day, something changed. It started small, a silly argument over a game at lunchtime. Words were exchanged, maybe a bit too harsh. Instead of talking it through, they let the silence grow. Soon, that small argument felt like a huge canyon between them. They stopped talking. stopped actively playing together, avoided each other in the walkways. What was once a strong connection had become a painful distance.

One afternoon, feeling hurt and angry, Sally thought, 'That's it. I don't want anything to do with Alison anymore. I'm going to build a wall around myself, ignore her completely, maybe even encourage others to leave her out too. I'll make sure she knows she's not welcome near me.' Sally was planning to build the biggest, strongest emotional 'fence' possible.

Just as Sally was deciding how high and thick her 'fence' should be, a wise teacher, noticing the sadness behind Sally's anger, quietly asked, 'What are you hoping to achieve by building that fence, Sally?'

Sally explained the plan, wanting to shut Alison out completely.

The teacher listened patiently and then said gently, 'I understand you're hurting. Building a fence might make you feel protected for a moment, but it will also keep you isolated. What if, instead of building a fence to keep Alison out, you thought about building a bridge to perhaps meet her halfway?'

Sally was taken aback. A bridge? After everything that had happened. It seemed impossible. But the teacher's words stuck. Sally thought about all the good times, the shared laughter, the support they used to give each other. Was building a wall really the best way forward?

Later that day, Sally saw Alison sitting alone, looking just as unhappy. Taking a deep breath, Sally made a different choice. Instead of building that wall of anger and silence, Sally decided to build a small bridge. It wasn't easy, but Sally walked over. 'Hey,' Sally started, feeling a bit awkward. 'That argument we had... it was silly. I miss hanging out.'

Alison looked up, surprised, then a small smile appeared. 'Yeah,' Alison replied. 'Me too. I'm sorry about what I said.'

They stood there for a moment, that first step taken across the newly built 'bridge' of apology and honesty. It wasn't a giant structure instantly fixing everything, but it was a start. They began talking again, slowly rebuilding their connection, piece by piece.

That 'wise teacher,' you know, wasn't necessarily building the bridge for them. They simply offered a different perspective,

encouraging Sally to see another possibility besides building walls. The real work, the brave step of building that bridge, came from Sally choosing connection over conflict.

Here at our school, we face challenges all the time. We might have disagreements, misunderstandings, moments where we feel hurt or angry. In those moments, we have a choice, just like Sally did.

Will we choose to build fences walls of silence, gossip, exclusion, or unkindness? Or will we choose to be bridge builders? Building bridges means choosing empathy - trying to understand someone feelings. It means choosing kindness, even when it's difficult. It means having the courage to apologise, or to forgive. It means reaching out to someone who looks lonely, including others in your games, or offering a helping hand with schoolwork. It means seeing past the disagreement to the person standing opposite you.

During Term 3, I encourage every single one of you - students and adults - to be bridge builders. Let's focus on strengthening our connections, resolving conflicts with understanding, and making our school community a place where everyone feels welcome, supported, and valued. Let's build bridges of kindness. respect, and friendship that make our school stronger and better for everyone.

Let's have a fantastic term filled with learning, growth, and connection.
