About the Role

 Aboriginal Education Officers provide assistance to teachers, Aboriginal students and their families to support improved learning, welfare and well-being outcomes for Aboriginal students.

Essential Requirements

- Valid Working with Children Check Clearance
- First Aid Certificate or willingness to undertake First Aid training
- Administration of Medications training to be provided based on student needs.
- Knowledge of and commitment to the Department's Aboriginal Education and Training policy.
- This position is designated for the employment of an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander person. Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander applicants must provide documentation upon appointment. More information can be found in the policy library under <u>Confirmation of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander Descent.</u>
