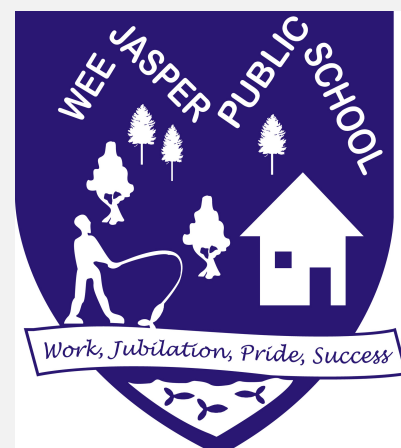

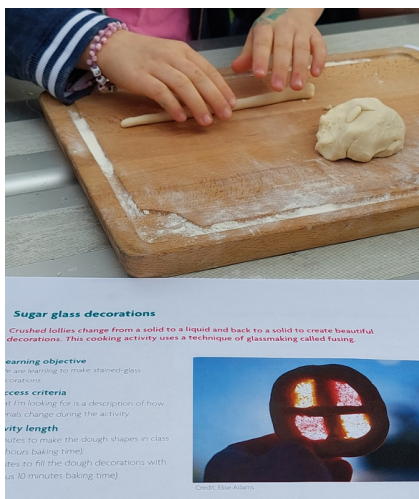
Science Week with Mr Morrison

Every year, Science Week has a different theme. The theme for 2022 was “Glass”, and our students explored how glass behaves under different conditions such as heat or cold, by making sugar glass decorations! They worked together to read the recipe, combined the ingredients, kneaded the dough and shaped their own decoration frames on the baking tray.

While we were waiting for the dough to bake hard in the oven, the students wrote a scientific report detailing the process they had undertaken, using headings such as “aim”, “method”, “results” and “conclusion”.

The next week, we began stage two: filling the holes in our dough decorations with powdered sugar made from different coloured crushed lollies. As they were returned to the oven, we watched as the sugar crystals melted together, creating a smooth translucent surface.

Hello Wee Jasper School Community,

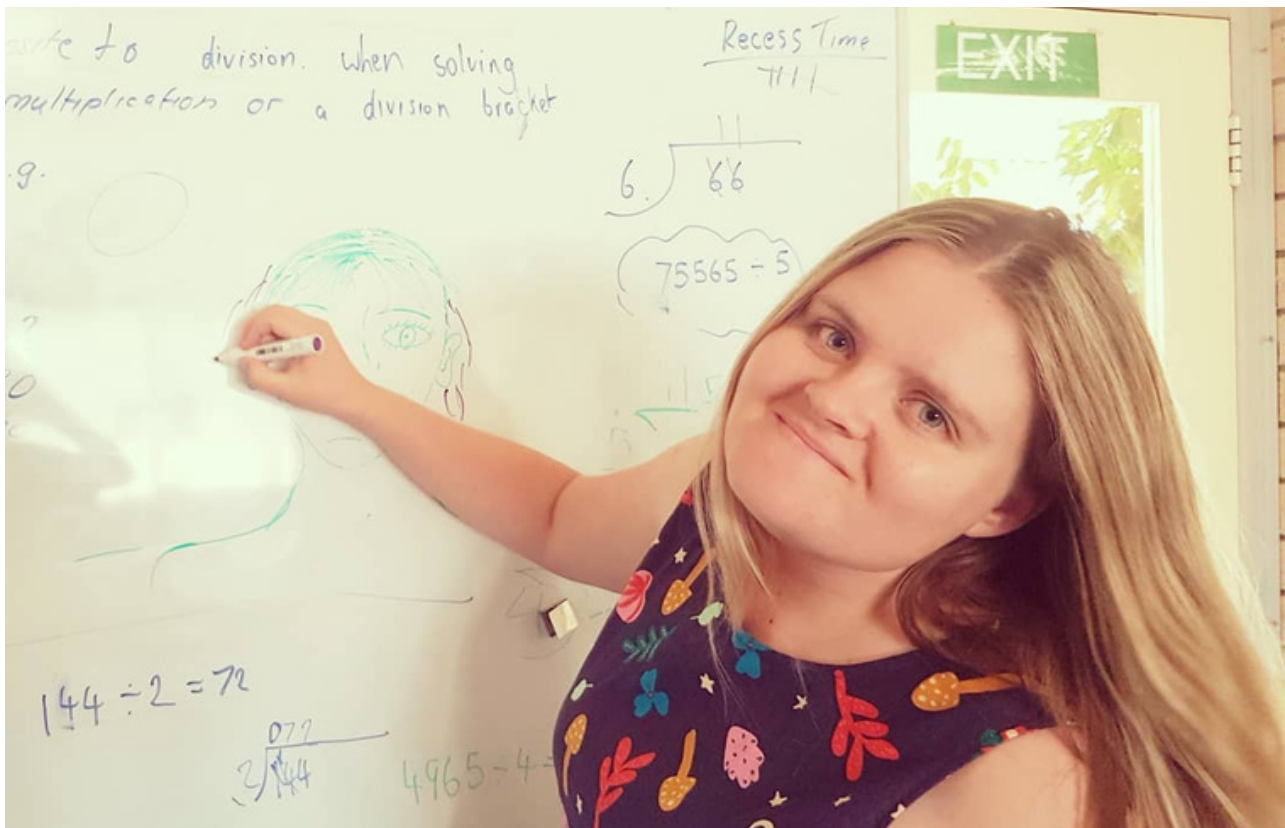

Learning with our Bowning Public School friends

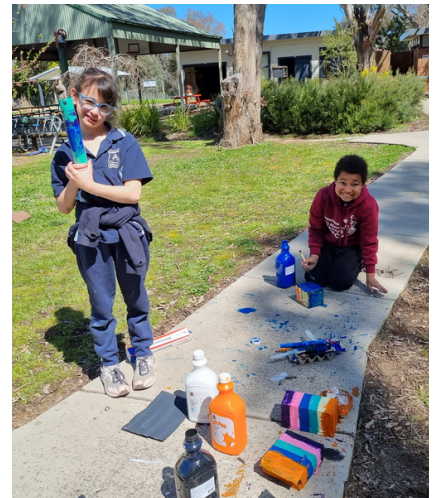

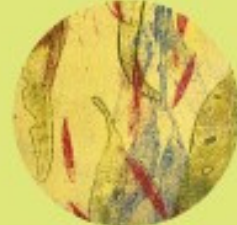

In good spirits - the mother and daughter behind Wee Jasper Distillery

If this isn't Australia's first mother and daughter-run distillery, it's certainly Wee Jasper's.

Meet Shannon (40) and Jennie Kellett (67), the women who have been brave enough to leave the capital and roll up their sleeves to craft gin, liqueurs, brandy, and soon maybe even whisky on the banks of Goodradigbee River. And boy are the locals excited.

What started as an experiment in their bathtub (but keep that to yourself), has turned into a full-time business and it's all thanks to Shannon's brother and Jennie's son, Nathan.

The family purchased the old Merino Wool Station on Doctors Flat Road in Wee Jasper in 2018 and Shannon and Jennie instantly fell in love with the land and area. So much so, they hatched a plan to leave Canberra and convert one of the old buildings on the property into their distillery.

After a little investigating, the mother and daughter discovered the property wouldn't meet the necessary approvals but were determined not to walk away from Wee Jasper.

It was a surprise phone call from a well-known local investor who offered to sell the pair the land near the bridge that paved the way for Wee Jasper Distillery.

Four years later and the impressive and modern cellar door and distillery are now complete, with Shannon and Jennie finishing the final touches, including seating and merchandise, before opening the doors in November.

"Mum and I always worked together and travelled together - we love discovering new food and drinks, so it made sense to do this together and we just dove in," said Shannon.

The duo is so committed to the distillery that Jennie has sold her physiotherapist business in the city while Shannon will split her time between her management role and the distillery. Shannon's other brother and Jennie's other son, Cameron, has also been assisting with all the distillery's marketing, labelling and website, while locals such as Jean Luc have raised their hand to help when the distillery opens.

Their spirits, made in handmade copper pots from Griffith and WA, will be available alongside local wines (including Wee Jasper Public School P&C's very own fundraising wine), beers and cheese boards at the cellar door, and locals will be pleased to hear that barista-grade coffee will be served from as early as 8 am between Friday and Sunday.

Among the spirits are a gin made with the Kunzea bush that's growing on the family's property and local rosemary; a pink gin; lemon and lime cello, all diluted with distilled Wee Jasper rain water, which tastes like water sweetened by angels.

It's set to be a popular venue, with the coming summer the perfect time to open to capture venturing campers and motorbike tours.

Nutrition Snippet

BLUEBERRY MUFFINS



Serves: 12

Ingredients

2 cups plain flour
1 cup oats (quick or traditional)
 $\frac{3}{4}$ cup brown sugar
1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp baking soda
 $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups reduced-fat Greek yoghurt
2 eggs, lightly beaten
50g margarine, melted, slightly cooled
1 tsp vanilla extract
1 cup fresh or frozen blueberries

Method

- 1) Pre-heat the oven to 180°C. Prepare muffin tins by greasing with margarine or spraying with oil.
- 2) Combine flour, oats, sugar, baking powder and baking soda in a bowl.
- 3) Combine yogurt, eggs, margarine and vanilla in a second bowl.
- 4) Fold the yoghurt mixture into the dry mixture and stir to combine. Gently fold in blueberries.
- 5) Spoon into muffin tins and bake for 20-25 minutes or until the top is golden and springs back when touched.
