How to Play Chess

First you have to set up all the 16 pieces on the board in their own positions and the Queen goes on her colour. So, if she is Black, she goes on Black. To start the game, White always goes first.

- You have only one Queen which can go move diagonally, vertically and horizontally along the chess board.
- You only have one King which can only go one little step on the chess board.
- You have two castles (Rook) and can go in any direction (horizontally and vertically) and as far as he wants.
- You have two Bishops that can only move diagonally as far as he can.
- You only have two Knights that can only move in an L shaped pattern and he can jump over pieces.
- You have eight Pawns which can only move one space at a time or two on your very first turn.

The aim of the game is to take out the other opponents King and their pieces on the board, along the way.

When you Check the other opponent, that means their King is in trouble.

When you Checkmate, that means the King can't move anywhere and it is Game Over!

The game can end in a draw by stopping the game or if both opponents can no longer make any moves.






