Principal's message

Our students continue to thrive with our STEM program. We are delighted to learn that we have been accepted to continue participating in STEM in 2024 with Miss Anna Kemp. This is wonderful for our students to ensure they access expertise and opportunity.

The students had a fun time at the Dinosaur Museum with Mrs. Rowling and Mrs. Griffiths. They had a wonderful time at the Agriculture Sleep Out in Crookwell, with students from our Breadalbane and Dalton STEM PLC. The students were exposed to knowledge and skills agronomist use. They conducted soil testing in different areas of the property to determine the moisture and PH levels. An agronomist talked about his job and the importance of soil management to benefit farmers and the environment. Our young students continue to grow in their confidence and skills to be independent learners and selfmanage while away from home.

They were outstanding at the presentation of their Smart City Showcase at Crookwell High School. Over the past two terms, the students have been learning about coding and how people use technology to overcome housing issues. They created a smart door and voice activated lights. The students enjoyed designing and making the furniture and décor the most. Watching our students discuss their design with the judges and other participants was aspirational. Our students are creative and confident young learners.

We are excited to welcome the students and staff from Dalton and Breadalbane this Wednesday for STEM. This time, we are returning to Careys Caves to showcase our local environment. Thank you to Geoff for hosting us again. I know our little learners are very keen to assist Geoff with his explanations.

This Friday we will join Bowning PS for a Colour Run with students from other small schools. The students will engage in a range of activities with RFS, police and Surf Lifesaving.

The students have been learning about the strategic game of chess. We are very proud of our Year 2 students who represented our school last Friday at the inaugural Small School Chess Tournament. Both Abi and Tilly competed enthusiastically and learned many new skills. We adore how positive our student's learning dispositions are. They know that as learners, each opportunity provides them with a way to demonstrate their current understanding but also to learn from and with others. We are also grateful that our families provide additional support at home to help prepare our students and give them opportunities to practice.

They also enjoyed making an outdoor shelter with Steph. Thanks to Outdoor Education for their fun visit.
















Smart City Showcase 2023

The Smart City project has been tailor-made for primary school students so they can be introduced to Science, Technology and Mathematics (STEM).

During Term 1, 2 and 3, our teachers and students have been learning and designing their Smart City, where they had hands on experience automating homes, exploring Smart Agriculture and envisioning the cities of the future.

Term 4 was about presenting their Smart City for judging at Crookwell High School. WJPS received an award for our Outstanding Achievement in the 2023 Smart City Project and a Green Life Solar Rechargable Kit.

Fun and Informative Excursions

Our staff and students had a great day out on 1 November 2023 to The Australian War Memorial and The Dinosaur Museum, both in Canberra.

The Australian War Memorial combines a shrine, a world-class museum, and an extensive archive. The Memorial's purpose is to commemorate the sacrifice of those Australians who have died in war or on operational service and those who have served our nation in times of conflict. Its mission is leading remembrance and understanding of Australia's wartime experience.

The National Dinosaur Museum houses over 150 dinosaur models, 23 complete skeletons, and over 300 displays of individual fossils in its multi-level indoor gallery, as well as a garden space featuring a 20-metre animatronic T. rex. The storytelling within its collection is linked to Australia, its history, and its preservation.

Our students also had the opportunity to attend Yass High School on 9 November 2023, as the Yass Music Club celebrated their 70th anniversary with the 'Power of Pop' with an hour long concert.

To celebrate their 70th anniversary, The Yass Music Club (YMC) is hosting musical-making marvel Laura Murphy (The Dismissal, Qween Lear) to show the youth how pop is a universal language for storytelling.




