## Principal's message

Our students have shined this term. We are so proud of the learning progression they have all made across all areas of school life. Their literacy and numeracy development are outstanding and they continue to eagerly attend to all learning opportunities. Next term, our focus will be to further their understanding of their own learning intentions and teachers co-construct individual success criteria with students, so they know how to improve and increasingly become more responsible for monitoring their own progress and achievement.

The students had many incredible opportunities in the later part of the term. Our newsletter highlights these and we hope you enjoy reading about them through the students' writing and photographs. I want to acknowledge Mary Goulding and Helen Cathles for all the work they do in creating our newsletters with our students. We have received significant positive feedback about both the newsletter itself and that a hard copy is delivered to community members letterboxes. Our students were fabulous at Pulse Alive where they joined the massed choir for a night performance. They remembered all their actions and songs and had a great sense of belonging with other students across NSW public schools. They have also recently connected with students from Karabar High School who have choreographed the dance our students will perform at the Southern Tablelands Dance Festival Goulburn next term. The students will also perform this dance at our 125-year Anniversary as well as songs from the choir. This collaboration is important for our students, as they continue to develop their confidence to learn from a range of people in different settings. Our students are very excited to dance again on a large stage.

Today our students are competing in the Burrinjuck Learning Community Cross Country at Gunning. We know our students will have lots of fun trying to complete the 2km course as quickly as they can. Our younger students will be smiling the whole way around the 1km course.

A massive thank you to our hard-working P&C who are running the canteen as both a community service and fundraiser. Our P&C combine with Dalton P&C and share the proceeds. Our school greatly values our P&C who support our school in ensuring our students continue to have wonderful resources and opportunity. Next term they are organising a Bunnings BBQ at Gungahlin for Saturday 20th July and a Firewood Raffle. We appreciate all the support we receive from both our families and community members.

The 125-year Anniversary planning continues, and we hope everyone will be able to join us on Saturday 31 August. We are working alongside a local mural artist Simon Sawell to design a mural which will feature around our concrete water tank and bore pump shed. Nathan Kellett is organising heritage carpentry demonstrations and workshops. It will be incredible for our community to explore carpentry techniques used 125 years ago. We know this will be a popular activity.


#### **Wee Jasper Public School's vision**

## Easter With Mrs Rowling


